Matchless wit

DIFFERENT PATHS TO
CREATING AN ATTRACTIVE AND
FUNCTIONAL DINING ROOM

One of life's great pleasures, eating, should take place in an atmosphere commensurate with the activity. While dining room styles are as varied as their owners, the basic issues are the same.

"Most people buy one dining room set in a lifetime," said Flegel's Furniture interior designer Frank Bence. "It's a major expense because you need six to eight chairs and that really adds up."

In order to make the right choices, Bence always gathers a plethora of information about the client's taste and lifestyle and the architecture of the home. "And I always ask to see the china," he added.

"I fit people to furniture the way others fit clothes," said Bence. "The chair has to be com-

fortable to sit in for at least three hours."

A common mistake is underestimating the size required for the rug, he said, adding that one needs to consider how far the chair pulls out. He also advises that there be a bare minimum of two feet from the edge of the table to the first thing that can be hit.

"I also like to make the dining room as user-friendly as possible," he said. He described a family with children who wanted to have dinner in the formal dining room every night. "We chose a vinyl chair fabric. It looked like silk, but it could be wiped down."

For those occasions that require extra seating, Bence recommends wood folding chairs upholstered in the same fabric as the dining chairs. "If you have a small antique table, you can have a folding plywood top made when you want to expand," he said. "But you need to have a place to store it."

Of course, many dining tables have leaves

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Lawnmower Blues

TRADE IN YOUR TWO-STROKE FOR A PUSH MOWER

Q: With the bloom of spring my lawn has been taking off. I went to start my old gas-powered mower for the first time this year and it didn't start again. Last year the same thing happened and I paid as much to get it fixed as a new mower would have cost. What can I do?

— Samantha in Sunnyvale

A: Although I am usually in favor of reusing rather than replacing, in this case there are some compelling reasons to discard your old machine and bring fresh thinking into the humdrum lawn mower. Lawn mowers may seem innocuous enough, but they are a horrible source of accidents and pollution. More than 75,000 Americans

are injured in lawn mower accidents each year. About 10,000 of those accidents involve children, often leading to the amputation of a limb.

Two-stroke gas engines, found in most lawn mowers (as well as leaf blowers, small watercraft, snowmobiles and chainsaws) are incredibly polluting. The average two-stroke lawn mower produces as many smog-producing hydrocarbons as 90 cars. Due to the inefficient design of the two stroke engine, they emit about a quarter of their fuel unused into

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your environment, along with a stream of oil. There are so many good alternatives on the market today that two stroke lawn movers should no longer be used.

Consider eliminating or reducing the size of your lawn. In addition to the mower issues, lawns suck down an inordinate amount of fertilizer, pesticide and water. Native drought-resistant plants make a wonderful substitute.

If that feels too radical, try using a hand-push lawn mower. Mowing lawns can be a great source of exercise, and can save time by integrating chores and cardiovascular exercise into one activity.

For larger lawns, consider an electric lawn mower. Although they are limited in range to about 100 feet from a power outlet, they are quieter, cheaper, more reliable and far less polluting than gas mowers.

If you must choose a gas mower, spend a little more and get a four-stroke engine. They last longer and significantly reduce the noise and pollution over a two-stroke.

Another tip: Don't use a basket to collect lawn clippings. Leaving the clippings on the lawn as mulch reduces watering needs and provides a bit of fertilizer back into the earth.

Q: My neighbor complained about the leaf blower my gardener uses. She says the dust it raises aggravates her allergies. I'd like to be a good neighbor,

but I don't want to upset my gardener either. I'm afraid if I ask my gardener not to use a leaf blower he will raise his price.

A: Like lawn mowers, leaf blowers are usually highly polluting two-stroke engines. A California EPA study found the hydrocarbon emissions from a half hour use of a residential leaf blower was equivalent to driving a car 2,200 miles. That's a lot of foul air.

In addition, leaf blowers generate winds of nearly 200 miles an hour, raising dust, molds, pollen, asbestos (from brake pads) and other particulates into the air. These particles can stay suspended in the air for weeks or months.

Try discussing other options with your gardener. Perhaps you can suggest that your gardener use a broom or rake on driveways, walkways and lawns and leave the leaves in planted areas as a ground cover. This should not take much more time than blowing. You might find your gardener is willing to work with you to find a solution.

With the help of educated consumers, many gardeners are coming around to the importance of preserving our local environment. In the process, some gardeners are finding leaf blowers are not such a big time saver after all. ▣

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that can be inserted. Round tables can be enlarged by inserting custom crescents around the perimeter. True marvels of engineering are the “round to round” expansions that have built-in inserts engineered to fold out into the spaces provided when the round table “breaks” into symmetrical units.

Before he sells a china cabinet, Bence ensures that the client really needs one. “If all you have on the shelves is the china you eat on, then it’s going to be empty when you entertain. They’re only useful if you have something you want to display.”

Eclectic Eichler

Soo-Ling Chan, an artist who lives in a South Palo Alto Eichler, has fashioned a witty and appealing dining room that is a good example of a space that “breaks all the rules” yet works because it reflects her personality. The first thing you notice is that nothing matches.

Although the eight dining room chairs are all about the same size, each one is a distinctly different style, united only by the fact that the room has a decidedly mid-1900s feel. Also, each seat is covered in different fabrics Chan bought from the former Turner Martin store in Palo Alto.

“I pick them [the chairs] up at yard sales and flea markets,” said Chan,

“and then my partner, Jerry Romano, restores them.” Each one has a story. “This Eames-style one was all sticky and greasy,” she said. “I bought it for \$2.” The one Chan refers to as “Dog Paw” because of the black-and-white spotted fabric — plus the added tail — was a 25 cent purchase.

The round glass dining table is supported by a bamboo-like base. On top is a vase made out of computer disks, compliments of a high-tech friend. Brightly painted wooden chairs stand against one wall and a white laminated buffet from Ikea, housing the speakers, along another. A string of “metal men”

walk across the wire light fixture that spans the room.

Chan loves to entertain. Over the years she has collected individual plates and she lets her guests choose the place setting that best fits their mood. The one that

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reads "You're special today" is reserved for birthdays.

Low profile approach

Catherine Ammann, who lives in Old Los Altos, has chosen a very subdued approach in designing her Japanese-inspired dining room. "I wanted a very low profile because the living and dining rooms are one room," she said.

The African wenge wood table (which can seat 14 when extended) and matching chairs were purchased at Limn in San Francisco. "I chose low seats so that they would 'disappear' when you sit in the living room," she said. When she has company, she uses custom-made slip

covers for all the chairs, including the extra folding chairs.

"I tried to reproduce the floors that you see in Japanese bed-and-breakfasts," she said, pointing to the wide-plank, hand-hewn hickory floor. The burgundy and teal Christopher Farr modern Turkish rug has a white line theme that is echoed in the living room rug.

The Italian plaster walls are a simple off-white, but provide dimension because they consist of three coats of varnish and one coat of wax. A stainless steel rod is the only indication of a storage closet.

"I didn't want a chandelier," said Ammann, "because that would have labeled this 'dining room.'" Instead, she relies on daylight from the bay window that overlooks the Japanese garden. By night the cove lighting in the soffit and

overheads in the redwood-beamed ceiling suffice.

A piece of acacia wood that projects from the wall acts as a buffet. The sparse furnishings accommodate a 15-foot-high grandfather clock, newly ebonized, that is a family heirloom.

Dining room trends

Over the past five years, Bence said, his clients have been more adventuresome with color, realizing that "it's only a coat of paint." He prefers bold colors and, in general, those that incorporate more

pink than yellow. His favorite is red, he said, because "it makes you hungry."

But his favorite dining-room story has nothing to do with ambience. Three daughters wished to inherit their mother's antique dining table. The mother solved the problem by having an antique restorer make two exact copies — right down to the dents and nicks.

"Each daughter swears that she has the original," he said. ▣
