Wiki whack

PENINSULA TECH ENTREPRENEURS SAY THE INTERNET'S NEXT PHASE WILL FOCUS ON COLLABORATION

For those who get frustrated trying to track down an elusive nugget of information someone sent in an e-mail six months ago; or who wish they could organize all the aspects of a project — e-mails, links, documents — in one place; or who want to allow a product to be modified by several members at once:

Welcome to the wonderful world of wikis.

The word is Hawaiian for “quick,” but the real lure of wikis is their ability to make Web pages editable and collaborative.

Until recently, they’ve been the realm of programmers, IT engineers and R&D departments. However, with the recent acquisition of the Palo Alto wiki company JotSpot by

Google, there’s been more talk of personable, friendly wikis that could turn things like e-mail and spreadsheets on their heads.

Many people’s closest brush with the technology is browsing Wikipedia, a free, online, user-editable encyclopedia. That site’s Darwinian approach — which assumes that good information will rise to the top and bogus entries will be edited into extinction — seems to work for the most part. Wikipedia is currently the world’s

largest wiki. It’s also a prime example of collaborative, interactive Web sites, which are proliferating like bacteria in a warm Petri dish.

So what’s all the excitement about?

Like blogs — which encourage instant posting and interactivity — and RSS feeds — which make Web content subscribable — wikis are doing their part to usher in a new Web era by making the Internet even more collaborative.

“Eventually, wikis will become as ubiquitous as e-mail,” said Ross Mayfield, a 36-year-old Palo Alto native and CEO of Palo Alto-based Socialtext.

“E-mail is push technology. You’re literally pushing information at

INCOMING COUNCIL MEMBER CREDITS LMV WITH FOSTERING HER LEADERSHIP SKILLS

Editor's Note: Leadership Mountain View (LMV) prepares adults who live or work in the city to take on a wide variety of leadership roles in the community. A program of the Chamber of Commerce Mountain View, LMV guides 32 individuals through a nine-month program each year. Over 450 persons have graduated from the program since it began in 1989. Margaret Abe-Koga completed Leadership Mountain View in 2001, after living in Mountain View for only a few years. At the time, she said, she felt that LMV would be a good way to gain "insight into our city and to learn of the various opportunities our city has to offer."

Since then, Abe-Koga has gone on to hold various community posts.

When asked how she got involved in this wide array of activities, Abe-Koga answered that she typically seeks out opportunities for involvement, citing the Human Relations Commission as one example.

She said she prefers to work "in the background, using my

organizational skills to get things done." In some cases, though, Abe-Koga is recruited based on an organization's preexisting need. One example of this is her work on the Mountain View Educational Foundation's 2006 spring fundraiser.

Several of Abe-Koga's recent roles have dictated that she be more at the forefront or "in the public eye." This culminated in her latest role, as one of three newly elected city council members.

Abe-Koga said the LMV experience required class members to be assertive and gave them practice in presentations. The class also provided connections to others actively involved in the community. She said there is a sense that "if you've taken LMV, you are or have the potential to be a leader."

This is truly what Leadership Mountain View is all about — recognizing the potential leader in all of us and helping us to act accordingly to better the community in which we live. ■

people. It works if you're e-mailing one or two people, but when you start communicating with a larger audience, it becomes much more like publishing. Wikis allow users to subscribe and add their own ideas to the discussion," Mayfield said.

Like a Web page, a wiki is blank until an author or team fills it with content. But since wikis invite edits and changes, the structure of the wiki becomes important.

"You could build a cathedral," Mayfield said, "and people would come and say how beautiful it is, but they wouldn't feel as if they could contribute anything to it. They'd be afraid to make a mess."

"With wikis, it's better to think of it like a sandbox where people agree on what they want to build. It's not top-down. The structure emerges on its own," he said.

For Socialtext, a major goal is to make the technology more user-friendly.

A basic wiki page from MediaWiki, for instance, looks like a clean slate. The complete lack of structure and the lure of wide-open possibilities could be great for creating, say, an encyclopedia. And that's exactly what Wikipedia's creators designed it for.

But if the goal is designing a collaborative space for organizing the local chapter of AYSO soccer (something Mayfield says

he's tempted to do), some may find the Socialtext framework a little more inviting.

"I wish I had a wiki for my Scout troop when I was growing up," he said.

Instead of keeping track of e-mail threads and reconciling disconnected communications with monolithic, non-editable Web sites, a wiki could conceivably consolidate conversations, documents, and internal and external links in one place, while remaining editable, trackable and collaborative.

And wiki users don't have to know HTML, the computer

Mountain View location for company events. The company is backed by Matrix Partners and Redpoint Ventures.

Road networks fail because of slow vehicles, oversized loads, accidents, poor interchange design, closed access ramps, road repairs, faulty traffic signals, too few lanes, toll gates and rush-hour congestion. Similarly, computer networks fail for a plethora of reasons. If you've ever experienced downtime on your DSL connection you can appreciate how difficult it is to decide whether it is your computer, your software, your router, your ISP's router, your ISP's server or a rotten telephone pole that is causing the outage.

The Fanfare Group's objective is to test network equipment functionality early in the design and development process. Tcl (Tool Command Language, www.tcl.tk) is an embeddable, extensible scripting language that engineers typically use to develop test plans. FanfareSVT, the Fanfare Group's main software product, is higher level than Tcl, enabling engineers to build automated testbeds and easily reconfigured test modules. FanfareSVT can also generate Tcl scripts.

An engineer can use FanfareSVT to test a router by quickly generating a myriad of operating scenarios. The router vendor benefits from faster time-to-market, more reliable products and lower tech support costs.

After a sumptuous breakfast, Kingston Duffie, Fanfare Group's CTO, started the Computer History Museum event by describing how software testing has evolved from manual testing to PERL scripts to Tcl — and now to Fanfare's technology. Today, Cisco's Desktop Switching Automation Team uses Fanfare's software to accelerate testing.

Tom Grennan from Vyatta, an open source router startup, explained how Fanfare's approach

helps them manage testing of open source network devices. Virtualization platforms like VMWare enable many network interfaces and user commands to be simulated and tested on one computer.

Bruce Nash from Ixia, a network protocol testing company, explained how the proliferation of network applications will increase the need for higher level testing tools like those from Fanfare.

A former Gartner Group analyst, Theresa Lanowitz from Voke (www.vokeinc.com), gave the results of a customer survey. She found that testers are now on a par with development engineers in most companies; as hardware functionality and network complexity increase, test engineering becomes a career destination.

According to Lanowitz, only 27 percent of those surveyed thought that being a test engineer was a stepping-stone to another job.

This event showed marketing savvy on Fanfare's part. Combining remarks from industry gorilla Cisco with open source vendor Vyatta, enterprise vendor Ixia, and industry luminary Theresa Lanowitz, the Fanfare Group

was able to attract high-caliber potential customers. And by creating a "webinar" from event content, they leveraged the marketing budget to reach hundreds.

Since the Tower of Babel, the quest for reliable communications between diverse communities has presented business opportunities and cultural challenges. Software that builds a test network and verifies that a device is reliable and easy to use is still quite far from being truly automatic.

The Fanfare Group takes vendors one step closer to building flawless networks. It is a slow process, but even a little company can improve gridlock on the communications highway. ■

language used to program Web pages.

One of Socialtext's clients, Ziff-Davis Media, claims to have saved a month on a recent four-month software project by using a wiki to replace the hundreds of e-mails

the team used to circulate. The Oct. 31 announcement of Google's purchase of JotSpot hasn't hurt wiki companies, either.

"Google's acquisition of JotSpot will ultimately monetize their use for individuals," Mayfield said. "The question it raises over time is, will Google eat

Wikipedia, or will Wikipedia eat Google? We might be moving into a time where just searching for information is less valuable than participating in it."

Analysts predict that the recent acquisition will mean that wiki integrations can link to Google Apps, the company's free, online suite of programs that emulate Microsoft Office.

JotSpot CEO Joe Kraus said the deal represents a major step forward in how people think about using the Internet.

"I think this validates that the Web is moving from a monologue to a dialogue," Kraus said. "We've already moved beyond an Internet where readers read and writers write. The success of blogs has proven we're a read-write Web, and wikis are going to be a big part that in the future."

Not to be outdone, PC chip-maker Intel announced at the recent Web 2.0 Summit in San Francisco that it would be bundling a software mash-up called SuiteTwo to give users the ability to add wikis, blogs, social networking and RSS feeds. Included is software from NewsGator, SimpleFeed, Six Apart and Socialtext.

Not bad for a company that started with \$5,000 in a garage on Churchill Avenue. Since its 2002 launch, Socialtext has

grown to 30 employees around the globe and counts 1,000 organizations as clients.

The next step, both companies agree, is growing beyond the workplace and into people's lives. Before its acquisition, JotSpot experimented with family sites that offered blogging, a family tree, photos and a calendar.

"It was a collaborative Web site with a wiki underneath. The same kind of thing could be used for class reunions, churches and clubs," Kraus said.

It's not the Web as we know it today, but according to Kraus, it will be how we use it in the future.

"The first 10 years of the Web was people saying, 'What do I do with it?'" Kraus said.

The answer wiki gives us for Web 2.0: Collaborate. ■
