## The billionaire's jeans

WHEN IT COMES TO 'BUSINESS CASUAL,'  
SILICON VALLEY TAKES THE CAKE

**A** decade ago, Silicon Valley moguls pioneered a look known as "business casual." Today, it's a fashion unto itself, sported by systems engineers in khakis and polo shirts, tech mavens in oversized shirts and flats, and the irrepressible Steve Jobs, in his signature black turtleneck and jeans.

The aesthetic has taken off, it seems, loosening ties everywhere. But office attire, even when casual, never seems to be as casual outside the office.

In Los Angeles, casual has transformed into "casual chic," said Laurie Pike, style director for Los Angeles Magazine.

"Fashion here is all about the lifestyle," she said. "It's expressive and people aren't afraid to show a little skin."

spend on work wear. "People here are trying to project an image of being 'with it' but not trying too hard," Pike said. "People don't want to look like too much effort went into what they're wearing."

The casual chic look, she said, is seemingly effortless, but pulled together. And while people often dress for ease and comfort, they still want to look good.

"Some of the revealing cuts women wear to work would raise eyebrows in other cities, but here it's just a part of the culture."

Workplace fashion in San Francisco is a touch less glamorous, but also more spirited, according to Simon Ungless, director of graduate fashion at the Academy of Art University in San Francisco.

"S.F. fashion is artistic and eclectic," he said. "It comes out of a free-thinking kind of crowd."

Ungless, who produces student runway shows in San Francisco and New York, said office attire in the Bay Area is more innovative and less trend-driven than what he sees on the East Coast.

"On the streets of Manhattan, you see the magazine trends copied in hair, makeup and attire, so it all gets a little tired," Ungless said. "They are well turned out, but a bit robotic."

San Francisco is, by comparison, an incubator of fashion trends. "There's a slightly more creative way of dressing here," he said. "The young people here are full of ideas, they're always creating

L.A. fashion, she said, is born of warm weather and a culture of beauty and fitness. As a rule, Angelenos steer clear of traditional attire, dressing in brighter colors and metallics, with women in head-turning prints and pumps and men in vintage Ts and designer jeans.

Pike emphasized that workplace fashion, even in the big city, is still a function of age and industry.

"You'll still see the black two-piece suit at a law firm or PR agency," she said, "but in a lot of workplaces, jeans and flip-flops are becoming the norm."

That doesn't mean Angelenos don't

## The eyes have it

EYEGLASSES HAVE BECOME SO STYLISH,  
EVEN PEOPLE WITH PERFECT VISION WANT A PAIR

**N**erds can breathe a sigh of relief: Eyeglasses have transformed from unwelcome stigmas into chic, desirable accessories.

The Peninsula is no stranger to the glasses craze. In fact, when glasses first started to scale down to smaller frame sizes about eight years ago, opticians had to adopt new techniques to accommodate all of Silicon Valley's computer users.

"The smaller glasses push the reading and distance areas together, which doesn't work well for people who use computers a lot," explains Bill Felices, store manager of For Eyes in Palo Alto's Town and Country Village. "We

had to start re-fitting the glasses to accommodate them."

Smaller frames marked the first stage in the metamorphosis of glasses from undesirable to fashionable. Now, high-end designers such as Burberry, Prada, Betsy Johnson and Caroline Herrera have joined the ranks of companies like Guess and Calvin Klein in the pursuit of creating fun frames.

Optician Eva Etter, who has owned Accent on Eyewear in downtown Menlo Park for almost 20 years, prefers to call glasses "eyewear" — or, alternatively, "the jewelry for your face." She travels around the world every year in search of new trends in eyewear that

she can bring to her store.

Etter said people are realizing that glasses can add to the wearer's features, rather than detract from them. Eyewear designers pay close attention to fashion as well as function.

"People are used to psychologically rejecting glasses, so we have to make them fun to wear," she said.

In an ironic twist, some individuals with 20/20 vision now find themselves coveting a pair.

"A lot of younger people come in and buy non-prescription glasses just to be in vogue," says Felices.

At Prospectacles Optometry in the Stanford Shopping

Center, optician Grace Tumg has noticed that customers are spending more time deliberating over the appearance of potential frames.

"They want to be a little different than everyone else," she says. "A lot of people even get two to three pairs for different looks."

According to both Tumg and Felices, the ratio of glasses to

contact wearers is about 70 to 30 percent — but glasses are recommended even for those who wear contacts.

"Contacts aren't the most comfortable thing to wear all day," Tumg explains.

#### Framing your features

As the old saying goes, the eyes are the window to the soul — so why not frame those windows in style? Etter, Tumg and Felices all identified plastic frames as one of the most prevalent trends in eyewear today. Stylish and functional, plastic frames can hold some of the stronger prescriptions, and often prove sturdier than lighter metal frames.

As plastics gain in popularity, the rimless glasses that were hot commodities several years ago are slowly fading, Felices says. However, many customers who desire a simpler look still veer toward the titanium and stainless steel options.

With the onset of plastics, the limited choices of brown, black or tortoise frames have expanded into a rainbow of colors. Vibrant shades are another current fad, says Etter, and warm colors such as reds and oranges correspond perfectly with the onset of autumn. Two-toned frames, in which the outside and

inside of the frames are accented with different, complimentary hues, have also emerged as a new trend in eyewear.

Just as you might put on a fancier necklace for a nighttime affair, you might also want to jazz up your regular pair of glasses for fancier occasions. Some opticians, such as Etter, will carry evening eyewear, which distinguishes itself from its daytime complement through its glitzier and more embellished qualities.

"There is even an option to put diamonds on them," she says.

#### Tasteful temples

The chic intricacy of glasses now extends beyond the frames. Designers of eyewear pay a significant amount of attention to the temples, which is the technical name for the sides of the glasses.

"In real life, we're being seen from the profile a lot, so the sides are very important," explains Etter.

From colors and gemstones to inscriptions and etchings, the temples are taking on a life of their own. They often provide an additional canvas for eyeglass designers to make their unique mark on their products.

"Brand recognition with glasses is really big," Felices says.

This holds especially true for children's glasses. In an attempt to make glasses less of a burden for children, the temples on children's glasses often feature trademarked characters such as Scooby Doo.

Although many designers choose to stamp their company name on the sides of their glasses, others use unique etchings or patterns. Many people don't want to be walking billboards, Felices says, and instead prefer the subtler trademarks.

The intricate temples on glasses can become a conversation piece in themselves.

"They really are works of art," Etter says.

## Here comes the sun

Even more popular than standard prescription glasses are sunglasses, especially in California. With our without prescription, sunglasses are considered fashion accessories.

With sunglasses, trends are always in a state of flux. The recently popular aviator frames, which feature oversized, teardrop-shaped lenses in wire metal frames, have seen a recent decline in sales, Etter and Felices say.

As with prescription glasses, sunglasses are now reflecting a retro style. The large, glamorous "Jackie-O" glasses of the 1960s are back, Etter says.

However, not everyone wants glasses that cover half of their face, she adds.

For those who prefer a classic pair of sunglasses, standard Ray-Bans are still popular. At Prospectives, many people, particularly men, tend to prefer the variety of polarized sunglasses made by Maui Jim.

## Helping you read

A majority of people don't require prescription glasses, but still need a pair of reading glasses. Even reading glasses have now been hit by the style bug.

Sold everywhere from your local drug store to Costco to small optical stores, reading glasses can be found in a variety of styles. At Prospectives, reading glasses range in cost from about \$45 to \$90 and are available in everything from the traditional silver and brown frames to bright purple.

Tumg advises people to keep in mind that reading glasses are sold with the same prescription for both eyes. But many people require different magnification

a lot. All of this needs to be kept in mind and communicated to your optician when you're buying a pair of glasses.

For children, consider buying glasses that are shatter-resistant with bendable temples to help guarantee that the pair will survive recess.

Prices for prescription glasses at these three stores range from \$150 to \$1,000. Although some eyewear might appear a bit pricey, Etter asks many of her customers to put the investment in perspective.

"People spend so much money on shoes, but it's the face that we really notice," she says.

"It's the first thing that people see when they look at you," Tumg echoes. □

strengths for each eye or have an astigmatism, which is an irregularly shaped cornea or lens.

To prevent buying the incorrect prescription, she recommends that everyone — even those who think they need only a little magnification — get regular eye exams.

## Shopping for your eyes

Asked for basic rules on how to pick the right pair of glasses for your face, Etter has two simple tips.

First, try not to match the shape of your face with the shape of the eyeglass frames. In other words, if your face is round, try to steer away from circular frames.

Her second tip is to work on accenting your eye color. A blue-based red, for instance, can really bring out dark brown eyes.

Although they can be trendy, eyeglasses are not merely a cosmetic accessory. One must keep in mind the medical aspect of eyewear, Felices says.

His philosophy is to fit the prescription to the frame and the face. A strong prescription might not work in certain frames, for example, or you might need bendable temples if you take your glasses on and off



something new."

In recent months, he said, San Franciscans have started to abandon casual wear for smarter, more formal styles.

"It seems right for men to wear ties again and to look slick," he said, adding that his designer jeans have been gathering dust in the closet, as men's fashion has turned toward more tailored looks.

Despite their pull in the big city, these trends have yet to make their way into Silicon Valley's high-tech offices, where business casual usually means jeans or shorts and a simple T-shirt — and no designer labels.

"I see these tech guys come in with their huge baggy shorts and their massive shirts, and think, well, that's what's going to be acceptable in the workplace, that's going to be the uniform," Ungless said.

"They come in and they're really young, they're all mak-

ing far too much money, and if you're VP of whatever it is, at 23, and you're coming in to work on a skateboard, then there's no other standard."

Famously, employees at places like Sun and Google dress as they please, putting a premium on functionality, comfort and college-dorm plainness. Some speculate this super-casual chic is due to the high tech industry's garage roots: Long hours shut up in a room, sitting in front of a computer, with little contact with the general public.

Sergey Brin, billionaire co-founder of Google Inc., created a stir on Capitol Hill last year when he arrived to meet with senators

while wearing jeans, sneakers and a black T-shirt. A D.C. blogger commented that he looked more like the maintenance man of a Boeing 767 than the owner of one.

The outfit was wrong for the occasion, no doubt. But if the tech industry has taught us anything, it's that style and success don't necessarily go hand in hand. □
