LOCAL farms LOCAL palates

Winemakers in Bordeaux have known about it for centuries: *terroir*.

It's the word the French use to describe the specific combination of climate, soil, geology and weather that make each vineyard and vintage unique. The term also describes how the convergence of these factors communicates a sense of place to the palates of those who enjoy their fruits, putting people back in touch with the land around them. It's a mouthful for just one word.

Even as the debate over "food miles" — whether locally grown food actually has a smaller carbon footprint than food that is shipped great distances — remains unresolved, *terroir* can offer its own compelling justifications: a more intimate relationship with food, with the environment, and with the society in which we live.

Here on the Peninsula, particularly at small farms like Hidden Villa, the

concept has become a driving force behind the farmers' work, culminating in so-called "community supported agriculture programs."

Members of such programs get to know the farming methods, the land and the people who produce their food, explained Jason McKenney, agriculture manager at Hidden Villa, the longtime community farm and camp program in Los Altos Hills.

Community supported agriculture programs are truly local, McKenney said. Even farms a few miles apart will produce different types, and tastes, of produce, which vary throughout the season. The system benefits both the environment and the people living in it.

"Environmentally, farms have been seen as an enemy," he said. "It doesn't have to be that way."

Driven out of their cars

AS GAS PRICES CONTINUE TO RISE, MORE COMMUTERS ARE TURNING TO PUBLIC TRANSIT

With Bay Area gas prices hovering near an all-time high, local public transportation officials say more Mountain View residents are gradually turning to buses, light rail and trains for greener, cheaper and faster commutes.

Following a national trend, the South Bay set another gas record this week with a gallon of regular gas reaching \$3.588, according to AAA of Northern California. Transit representatives say the current prices, among the highest in the country, have contributed to an increase in riders on both Caltrain and Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority buses and light rail.

"A large portion of riders are transport-dependent," said Bernice Alaniz, VTA deputy director

of marketing and public affairs. "Things like four dollars for gas could impact their ability to drive because of financial resources."

Alaniz added that besides these fiscal incentives, more people are turning to public transit as an environmentally friendly way to commute. She said that overall ridership in January 2008 increased by nearly 3 percent compared to ridership in January of the previous year.

"High gas prices, people being more environmentally friendly and visibility of green house gases have all contributed to the increase in ridership," Alaniz said.

VTA started a bus program in January with different routes and schedules which could also explain the upward shift, she said.

A million tons a year

TASK FORCE ESTIMATES CITY'S GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS — AND WORKS ON WAYS TO CURB THEM

Mountain View generates nearly a million tons of carbon emissions every year, according to data presented to the city's new Environmental Sustainability Task Force, which has until August to come up with ideas to reduce the output.

"The need for action is real and urgent," said Bruce Karney, chair of the task force. "We may not think of every good idea between now and August, but I suspect we'll think up most of the good ideas."

With the help of old PG&E records, traffic data and the expertise of the International Council for Local Environmental Initiatives (ICLEI), the

city calculated its 2005 "baseline" — 925,691 tons of greenhouse gas emissions from such sources as cars, electricity use, natural gas heaters and the methane gas emanating from the Shoreline landfill.

Taken per capita, that comes to 13 tons of carbon emissions per resident per year, on average, which is similar to Palo Alto's baseline for 2005.

The top sources of emissions are transportation at 46 percent and waste at 21 percent, followed by commercial (17 percent), residential (11 percent), and industrial (5 percent).

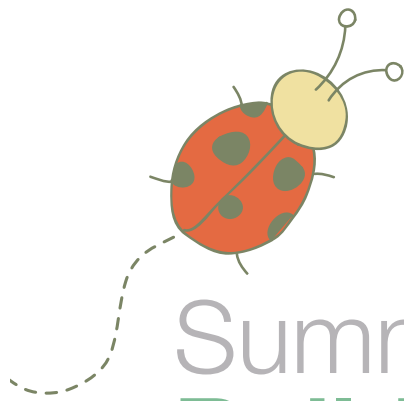
While the data makes for a good starting point to gauge the city's future success, it may or may not be useful in compar-

ing different cities, said Micah Lang, a Berkeley program manager for ICLEI, which is based in Ontario, Canada.

"Each city is very unique in their residential breakdown," Lang said. "Some cities are job centers with a lot more commuters. Some cities have huge thoroughfares."

Comparisons may also be flawed because the data for each city is based on different assumptions. Last year, Palo Alto worked independently of ICLEI and "went through a process that is a bit more stringent or detailed than 95 percent of cities in California," Lang said. In one example, Palo Alto went calcu-

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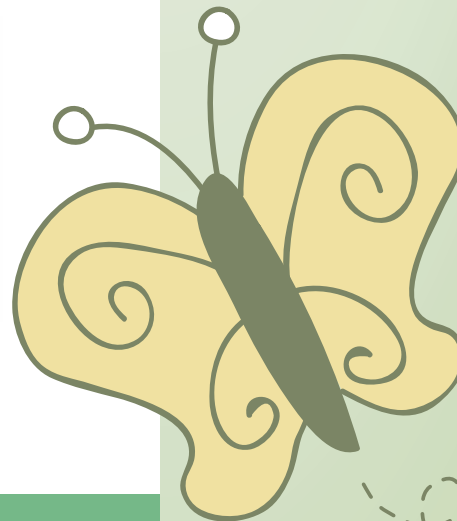

Meanwhile, the transit agency itself is becoming more eco-friendly, after VTA board members last month approved a sustainability program to reduce energy use in the company's offices and vehicles. As part of the project, VTA replaced 10 of its vehicles with hybrid cars and is instilling motion detectors to guarantee that lights get turned off when employees leave.

In addition, as part of continued community outreach, VTA employees travel to local schools to teach students how to be more environmentally friendly, and the company offers other business and communities, such as San Jose State University, reduced prices if they buy monthly transport passes for all members.

Surge in Caltrain riders

Mountain View's downtown station was the third most used Caltrain stop in 2007, behind only San Francisco and Palo

Alto, respectively. As with most of the trains' stops, the station attracted more passengers this year as gas prices grew.

Ridership at the Mountain View and San Antonio stations both increased by almost 9 percent from 2006 to 2007, while Caltrain experienced an overall jump of almost 6 percent in ridership this year, said Caltrain spokesperson Christine Dunn.

According to a Caltrain survey conducted in February, nearly 3,000 people got on and off at the Mountain View stop each day last year, and 525 at San Antonio. In 2007, each weekday an average of 34,000 riders used the diesel trains, which travel from Gilroy to San Francisco.

"Every year we count each person who gets on the train and we can see trends," Dunn said.

Although the jump in ridership is due in part to lower ticket prices and the success of Caltrain's bullet trains, Dunn said gas prices also play a role. The company's Web site even provides customers with a gas calculator to "calculate how much it costs to drive and how much it costs to take a bus or train," she said. ■

lated emissions from residents' air travel outside the city, something Mountain View and other cities aren't doing, causing Palo Alto's per capita numbers to be higher.

So far, Mountain View's inventory does not take into consideration emissions from city government operations. Task force coordinator Steve Attinger said that would be added later in the year, but would likely be 1 to 3 percent of the city's total emissions.

"The footprint of city operations in the whole scheme of things is almost negligible," Attinger said. "But if we're going to be walking our own talk, it's going to need to be done."

It may also be a challenge, because the city government has already completed a long list of projects to reduce its greenhouse gas emissions, including solar panels on city buildings; a fleet of hybrid, electric, and biodiesel vehicles; and power generation from methane gas at the former Shoreline landfill.

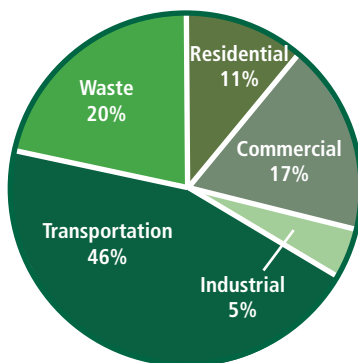
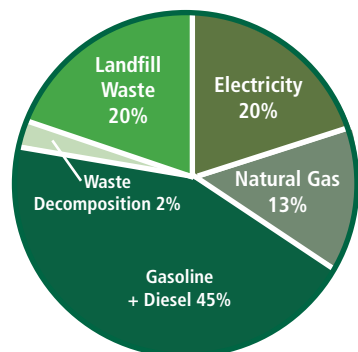
Variety of solutions

Lang says there is a never-ending array of methods to reduce a city's emissions, many of which are outlined in ICLEI's "best practices and case studies," listed on its Web site.

One clear direction for the task force is to focus on transportation, by far the biggest source of greenhouse gas emissions in Mountain View. Electricity use throughout the city creates

another 20 percent — about the same, in its effect as a greenhouse gas, as the emissions coming from the Shoreline landfill.

(The landfill's methane emissions are not the same in tonnage, however, because not all greenhouse gases are alike: Methane is a much more potent greenhouse



gas than carbon dioxide. For sake of comparison, the task force calculated the methane's effect as an equivalent of carbon dioxide or carbon monoxide.)

One way to lower electrical and natural gas consumption is through green building design. To that end, City Council member Ronit Bryant made a motion Feb. 26 to discuss several proposals

for encouraging greener building developments in Mountain View. Bryant wanted to require that new city buildings over 5,000 square feet in size be certified by Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design, or LEED. She also wanted the city to have developers fill out a "green checklist" as part of development applications.

The motion was opposed by a council majority, with some members saying the ideas should first go to the city's task force.

Getting to work

On March 3, the task force split into several sub groups: Transit and Transportation; Baseline and Measurements; Energy/Renewable Energy; Built Environment; Adaptation to Climate Change; Suburban Natural Ecosystems and Biodiversity; Waste, Waste Reduction and Recycling; Water Availability and Use; Air Quality, Environmental and Social Justice; Greenhouse Gases; Land Use Planning; Population Control; Minimizing Toxics; and, finally, Communications, Public Education and Outreach, and Business Development.

The groups now have just seven months before the August deadline.

"It's a pretty big task we've given them," Attinger said. "I personally suspect they might run over. But with 68 people involved, more hands make light work."

Residents get second chance at solar group buy

It's been a year since homeowners organized Mountain View's first-ever group purchase of solar power arrays, and now residents say they are back for a second run.

Last year, Bruce Karney helped bring together dozens of fellow residents for a group buy with SolarCity, a Redwood City-based company which installs solar arrays on private residences. Ultimately, 118 Mountain View households received a group discount through the program.

This year, "We're hopeful that we'll get an even larger response," said Karney, who in the interim has taken a job with the company.

This year, the minimum number of households needed for the discount to take effect is 20. The discount for homeowners will be as high as 20 percent.

Tax credits on solar panels are

reduced this year, and so the cost for an array is expected to rise to somewhere between \$15,000 and \$20,000 for the average-sized home, Karney said. Most people pay for the panels with a second mortgage on their homes, he said, adding that the panels can pay for themselves after 10 years and will likely last another 20 years after that.

Former City Council member Mike Kasperzak, who has had SolarCity's panels on his own home for almost a year, is leading the effort on the community level.

"I've been pretty happy with mine," he said, noting that one effect of the solar array is that he's become more energy conscious.

"In August, September and October my entire electrical load was covered by the panels," Kasperzak said. Last month, due to the reduced sunlight of winter, he had to pay \$30 to PG&E.

The cutoff date for those wish-

ing to participate in the upcoming Mountain View group buy is April 30, said Kasperzak.

"We've got to get on the bandwagon now, because the federal tax credits are diminishing," he said. "The time is now." ■
