## OBAMA VS. MCCAIN, AND SO MUCH MORE

The sample ballots hitting mail boxes in Santa Clara County for this election should remind voters that they are making many important choices beyond who wins the big seat in Washington.

In Mountain View, there is an important election between nine candidates for four open City Council seats. The winners add up to a majority of the seven-member council, and will take over during a tumultuous time for local governments.

There are also important votes to be made among the dozen measures on the state ballot. Proposition 1A, the \$9.95 billion bond issue for high-speed rail, is stirring emotions for residents along the Caltrain line, including in Mountain View, where a significant amount of work would be required at the north end of Castro Street. Other issues tap voter sensitivities on gay marriage, care of animals, notifying parents about teen abortion, renewable energy, law enforcement, redistricting reform and \$900 million for veterans.

At the county level, there are several important ballot issues, including Measure B, which would authorize a 1/8th-cent sales tax to cover BART operating costs if a 16.1-mile extension to San Jose is built. And Measure A would raise \$840 million in bonds to rebuild and retrofit two hospitals in San Jose.

Voters will also decide whether to elect Democrat Paul Fong or Republican Brent Oya to fill Sally Lieber's state Assembly seat. And longtime Democratic Congresswoman Anna Eshoo is expected to be an easy winner on Nov. 4.

Because of the high-intensity presidential race, county election officials are bracing for an unusually high turnout of 80 to 85 percent, according to Elma Rosas, a spokesperson for the Registrar of Voters. As of Tuesday, 751,000 voters had registered, she said. But registration is open until Oct. 20, and is expected to climb even higher.

Absentee voting, which began on Oct. 6, the same day the ballots were mailed, may alleviate the lines at polling places. Election officials say far more residents will vote by mail — some 400,000 — than at polling places in this election. Rosas urged mail-in voters to send in their ballots as soon as possible, so signatures can be checked and verified and counted a few days before the election, although no tally is compiled until after polls close.

Depending on how many voters actually cast ballots, results could be available as early as 10 a.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 5, or by noon if there is a large turnout.

## 9 CANDIDATES, 4 OPEN SEATS IN COUNCIL RACE

On Nov. 4, Mountain View voters will decide who among nine candidates will take four open seats on the seven-member City Council.

The *Voice* offered one-hour interview sessions to all candidates, and seven of the nine accepted.

### CHRIS CLARK



**AGE:** 25

Chris Clark grew up on a farm in Illinois and his political experience is mostly as a page in the U.S. House of Representatives. But the Stanford graduate calls himself a "geek" when it comes to local politics, and he sometimes peruses the city budget just to see how money is being spent.

He agrees with many of the recommendations in the recently released Environmental Sustainability Task Force report on land use, including the proposal that the city build more housing in the Shoreline area. But city development should be done "gradually and intelligently," he says.

Clark's candidacy marks his coming out as a gay man to much of his family, and he may be the first openly gay candidate in city history.

"Mountain View's support for our young people can be better," Clark wrote in an e-mail. "We should study the most effective programs in other cities." A new teen center is also a goal for Clark.

Clark says he is interested in attracting new companies to Mountain View, such as Facebook, which reportedly is looking for a new site.

But his top priority, he said, is to make sure the city uses "fiscal restraint as we ride out this cycle of economic instability, rising energy costs and an unpredictable real estate market."

He has been endorsed by the Sierra Club, the Democratic Party and Mountain View's Advocates for Affordable Housing.

Clark said he hopes to join a city commission if he does not win a council seat.

### ALICIA CRANK

Crank ran for City Council in 2006 and has spent seven years on the Human Relations Commission. The marketing specialist moved to the area from Detroit in 1998.

More than the others, Crank has made public safety a priority, and she has gotten the endorsement of the Firefighters Association. She supports programs like the Gang Task Force and the Police

Activities League.

"I definitely support a teen center," she said.

Crank is a strong advocate of a city-run shuttle system, especially one that would go up Shoreline Boulevard.

Crank says the city needs to raise its BMR in-lieu fees on developers so that more below market rate units will be built as part of housing projects. She said she wasn't concerned with scaring off developers in a worsening housing market.

"The BMR ordinance needs to be revamped completely," she said. "We have the lowest in-lieu fees in the county."

She said she would not like to see the city grow too much, but favors development along major traffic corridors. She said she would work to preserve the city's affordable apartments and older neighborhoods.

Crank was one of the only candidates to say that the finance director should stop doing double duty as the city's internal auditor, especially since Bob Locke has now retired.

### TRACY GORDON

Tracy Gordon was unknown to City Hall insiders two months ago. After moving here from the East Coast 11 years ago, she says she has gained a unique perspective as a "mom around town" with her 3-year-old twins.

She rents a house behind City Hall on Franklin Street with her husband, a laser engineer, and works part-time as a bartender downtown.

"I want to be the voice of the people, because I am one of the people," she said in a video statement on YouTube.

Her top priority is to work with the Chamber of Commerce to increase economic vitality downtown, but she says she doesn't believe big chain stores would fit the character of downtown. Her second priority is "to work with Parks and Recreation to tackle maintenance issues, ensuring that our children can play in safe and clean environments," her Web site says.

Gordon said she would work with others to make sure the city builds affordable housing, but "Mountain View's development needs to slow down," she said. "There is already too much congestion."

"I see a lot of high density housing going up [but] I don't see anything affordable coming out of it."

As a possible solution to city financial troubles,

Gordon says she would support the development of a hotel to bring in visitors and tax revenue. She also supports a new teen center in Mountain View.

### JOHN INKS

John Inks, a retired aerospace engineer who lives on Showers Drive, was the fourth-highest vote-getter in the 2006 election, losing by 300 votes to Jac Siegel. He has served on the Environmental Planning Commission, which he now chairs, for the last two years. Before that he was a member of the Parks and Recreation Commission for many years.

"Figuring out how the city should grow in the future while preserving quality of life and open space — while allowing growth in population and the economy — that's what I have chosen to do," he said.

Though he is a Libertarian, he believes the market will take care of certain problems with the "right help" from the city, such as zoning incentives to redevelop San Antonio shopping center.

In an interview two weeks ago, Inks said the state government would be issuing mandates that cities build housing to accommodate California's population explosion.

"I'm not one to turn a blind eye to a tidal wave," he said about incorporating projections for population growth in city planning.

He said the many of the 3,500 homes in the planning pipeline won't be built. Some have entitlements that will expire before they can be funded, he says, while others will never get off the ground.

Inks has developed an interest in walkability, practical energy conservation methods and the city's community emergency response teams. He said his top priority is to maintain quality city services in the face of looming budget problems.

"We should be looking for some significant retail development," he said, to "backfill" the loss in sales tax revenue from the dot-com collapse.

### MICHAEL KASPERZAK

With eight years on the City Council already under his belt, Mike Kasperzak says he knows the potential that exists in Mountain View. In returning for a third term after a two-year break, Kasperzak follows a tradition set by former council members including Pat Figueroa and Angelo Frosolone.

In the first two council debates, Kasperzak often had the most detailed answers on questions requiring historical knowledge, sometimes

leaving other candidates to say little except that Kasperzak summed up the issue well.

His top priorities are affordable housing, fiscal responsibility and open space, including a major park in the Whisman area.

Kasperzak said the time isn't right to raise BMR fees on developers, though he has advocated doing so in the past. Endorsed by the Sierra Club, he says that "making people live in Tracy isn't sustainable" and would consider incentivizing the inclusion of affordable housing as part of new developments. He says over 100 affordable units have to be built every year to meet demand, and new rental housing would have to be part of the solution.

One of Kasperzak's most unique positions is that the council should create a policy encouraging city planners to present their professional opinion of a project's design in city council meetings, an effort to improve project quality after he learned that he had supported projects in the past that he later discovered planners did not like.

He also wants to see the council make difficult decisions regarding employee salaries in order to maintain city services and the city's triple-A credit rating. That may be why the Firefighter's Association did not endorse him.

Much of the area's political establishment has endorsed Kasperzak, including county tax assessor Larry Stone, county Supervisor Liz Kniss and State Senator Joe Simitian.

## LAURA MACIAS

Laura Macias has served four years on the council and served as mayor last year. She has a long resume of local involvement over the last 20 years; she was a founding board member of Mesa de La Comunidad and had stints on the planning and parks and recreation commissions.

Macias signed the U.S. Mayor's Climate Change Agreement for Mountain View in 2007, and was a key advocate of the city's Environmental Sustainability Task Force. Now that the task force has released its report, Macias agrees with the "healthy villages" concept for city planning, and says the downtown is a good model for Mountain View's neighborhoods to emulate.

Macias advocates a city-run shuttle system that could cost \$250,000 a year to operate.

Preserving the character of neighborhoods is a big issue for Macias, who says the general plan update is a big motivator for her running for reelection.

Her voting record shows she has rejected the highest density housing projects. She often points to the 3,500 homes in the planning pipeline as evidence that the city doesn't need to build quickly — "We're going to grow a lot," she says.

Macias wants two new major parks built in the city, especially one for the Whisman area.

## JOHN MCALISTER

John McAlister, a 50-year resident of Mountain View, was appointed to the Environmental Planning Commission last year. He says the city

needs to make sure its infrastructure and revenue sources are adequate before substantial housing growth is allowed.

When asked how he would deal with gang and youth crime, McAlister said he would consider ways to work with Immigration and Customs Enforcement to deport certain offenders.

To address environmental sustainability, McAlister proposes a hydrogen station for the city's fleet in partnership with Valley Oil.

To improve the city's tax base, he proposes that a large chain store move into the downtown, such as the JC Penney's that moved into the Meyer's appliance building decades ago. He said he would have supported bringing Home Depot to San Antonio shopping center.

"If a Home Depot can bring in \$500,000 a year [in taxes], we should find a place for it," McAlister said.

McAlister claims he is the only candidate with the "whole package," and says his life experiences make him qualified. He owns the Baskin Robbins ice cream shop on El Camino Real, and obtained a degree in business administration from UC Berkley in the late 1970s.

His two teenagers attend local schools, where he is a major fundraiser and member of the PTA and school site councils.

McAlister said he has "not accepted financial support or endorsements from any special interest group."

Tom Means is the city's mayor for 2008 and has served four years on the council. He has lived in the city since 1981 and is married with two grown sons. He has served on the Parks and Recreation Commission, coached Little League teams for many years and served on the Moffett Field Restoration Advisory Board.

Means, an economics professor at San Jose State University, said he learned how to get things done in politics while serving on boards at the university. He believes voters appreciate how he makes decisions with the informed perspective of an academic. He recently completed a research paper finding that California cities that subsidize housing through developer fees produce less new housing and have higher housing prices.

Among his council accomplishments is the regular summer closing of Castro Street for Thursday Night Live, which was his idea. He picked the members of the Environmental Sustainability Task Force which produced a 300-page report last month.

Though community members weren't sure of his commitment to a teen center earlier this year, he has promised his support for one — as part of a new community center at Rengstorff Park.

"We need to get moving on that," he said.

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# 3 HOPEFULS VIE FOR 2 SEATS IN HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT

After 10 years of uncontested elections in the local high school district board, Mountain View residents will get to choose between two incumbents and a challenger when they go to the polls next month.

Three candidates are running for two spots in the Mountain View-Los Altos Union High School District. Incumbents Susan Sweeley and Phil Faillace are endorsing each other, while challenger Colin Rudolph says the board needs a new perspective.

The district's five school board members receive a monthly stipend of \$250 in exchange for attending bimonthly meetings, campus events at the three high schools and adult school, and meet other obligations.

Another seat on the board, the two-year appointment of Joe Mitchner, also was up for grabs, but he running uncontested in his bid for reelection.

Meanwhile, the Mountain View Whisman School District has its own uncontested election: Terms expire at the end of the year for trustees Fiona Walter, Ed Bailey and Gloria Higgins. Higgins is stepping down to pursue a career in teaching and will be replaced by Stephen Olson.

## PHIL FAILLACE

Phil Faillace, who is running for his fourth four-year term, says trustees must continue to assure that the curriculum challenges all students whether they are underachieving, average or advanced. The board has been successful in helping narrow the achievement gap for Latino and other students, but needs to take more risks and allow teachers to be more creative as the gap

persists, he said.

Four of the five members have been on the school board for at least eight years, and Faillace says these trustees work well together. During the last decade the board has opened access to more advanced placement classes and brought a media and technology program to the district.

Faillace, a Los Altos resident, said he grew up in a working-class neighborhood in Philadelphia where locals insisted on good public education. He says it is now his turn to make sure students are able to attend good public schools.

The candidate said he has not been directly seeking endorsements, but former high school district superintendent Rich Fischer supports him.

Colin Rudolph says that as trustee he will help build new partnerships and push for more competitive technology on the campuses. Through these partnerships with neighboring

schools and technology companies, the district can help narrow the achievement gap and challenge all students.

The district needs more programs like Middle College, he says, which offers small classes at Foothill College for students who do not do well in the traditional high school setting.

Rudolph, a Los Altos resident and account executive in the technology industry, says he wants to give back to the community, and pave the way for his two young daughters. He says he will step down after two terms as they enter high school.

Rudolph is the only candidate endorsed by Los Altos Mayor Val Carpenter.

The budget is the biggest obstacle facing the schools, Susan Sweeley says, especially during the current economic turmoil and as California public schools face cuts. Although the high school district has not yet had to slash funding, Sweeley wants to

keep any cuts away from the classrooms.

Sweeley, a Los Altos resident, started volunteering in the community schools 20 years ago when her two children started school in Los Altos. During her eight-years on the board, she says, her relationships with community members have been most influential in helping her pass policies that benefit all students.

She tutors an at-risk youth, and points to one-on-one mentoring as an effective tool in closing the achievement gap.

Sweeley's endorsements include state Sen. Joe Simitian, Assemblywoman Sally Lieber, Mountain View Mayor Tom Means and Foothill Trustee Laura Casas Frier, among others. ▀

# LOCAL MEASURES SUPPORT BART, COUNTY MEDICAL SERVICES

Late last month, the California Transportation Commission unanimously agreed to provide \$240 million to extend BART to San Jose and Santa Clara, securing all necessary state funding — a total of \$760 million — for the \$6.1 billion, 16-mile project. The vote added one more “puzzle piece” of funding for the project, advocates said.

A bigger piece could materialize this Nov. 4, when county voters must decide

whether to approve Measure B, a 1/8-cent sales tax increase that would be used to pay for the operation and maintenance of the BART extension. The measure requires two-thirds voter approval.

If passed, the tax increase would only go into effect if all state and federal financing is secured to construct the project. The measure's backers — primarily the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority — were very careful in crafting a specific sales tax with plenty of stipulations after a half-cent tax failed to garner 50 percent of

the vote two years ago.

Opponents say the measure will drain money from other much-needed transit services, and they point out that some county residents will receive little direct benefit from the BART extension, even though they're paying for it. Groups opposing Measure B include the Sierra Club, the Silicon Valley Taxpayers' Association and VTA Riders' Union.

Supporters, which include a majority of county and state elected officials and the Silicon Valley Leadership Group, say the

extension is essential for closing a gap in the Bay Area's transit services. They say it would ease traffic regionally, and do not believe that other VTA services would be affected.

The other local measure with the biggest financial wallop is Measure A, which would provide \$840 million for a seismic retrofit of the Santa Clara Valley Medical Center, bringing it up to code with new state regulations.

According to county officials, who put

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
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## PROP. 4 REQUIRES PARENTAL NOTIFICATION IN TEEN ABORTIONS

For the third time in four years, California residents will vote Nov. 4 on a parental notification law, which if passed would require that a minor's parents be informed 48 hours before she receives an abortion.

Proposition 4 holds a slim lead according to a September field poll, and local voters on each side are scrambling to get the word out with only a few weeks until the election.

If Californians vote yes on Prop. 4, a teenager could not receive an abortion until at least 48 hours after her parents were notified. Under the proposition, a doctor would be required to inform the parent or another adult family member, or be charged with a misdemeanor and face civil action from the parents or the child's representative. A judge could waive the notification requirement under special circumstances.

Opponents say the proposition looks good on paper, but does not consider teenagers who come from abusive families or cases involving incest. If a minor successfully navigates the court system, she would have to say her parents abuse her in order to receive a waiver, according to Fran Linkin of Mar Monte Planned Parenthood in San Jose, who

opposes the proposition.

"Police will go to that same door she didn't want police officers going to in order to investigate abuse," Linkin said. "Teens are just not going to come in and instead do something desperate because of this law."

Linkin said the law is trying to "fix something that is not broken. ... If teens come from a safe home, they normally bring their parents."

Willie Lopus, who runs the Juan Diego Women's Center, a Catholic pregnancy center in San Jose for women in trouble, celebrated the lead.

The current law "makes no sense," he said. "If you have a young girl who is about to undergo a major operation, it makes sense that a family member knows."

Paul Laubacher, a spokesperson for the Yes on Prop. 4 campaign, said the measure follows the lead of dozens of other states in protecting minors. Supporters named the proposition "Sarah's Law," after a 15-year-old girl who received an abortion from a women's clinic and later died from an infection.

"This proposition would bring protection to families that isn't in the public policy arena," Laubacher said. ▀

## PROP. 5 WOULD EASE PRISON TERMS FOR DRUG OFFENDERS

California's drug offenders need more treatment options to cure their addiction, panelists said during a discussion last weekend on Proposition 5, which could change sentencing practices for nonviolent drug offenders.

The local panelists — judges, a public defender and a policy analyst — debated whether Prop. 5 would provide the necessary resources for addicts by allocating \$460 million each year to expand rehabilitation programs for drug offenders and parolees while limiting judges' authority to incarcerate.

During the panel, Jane Marcus, a board member of Women of Reform Judaism with a doctorate in policy analysis, and James Egar, a Monterey County public defender, supported the proposition, saying it would provide much-needed substance abuse and mental health programs for offenders of certain drug crimes.

By contrast, Stephen Manley and Paul Cole, Santa Clara County Superior Court judges, oppose Prop. 5. Although they agreed that more programs for drug offenders are needed, they said this measure, also known as the Nonviolent Offender Rehabilitation Act, would only add new levels of bureaucracy without providing enough accountability for offenders. They added that Prop. 5 would help to "legalize" drugs by focusing primarily on mental health.

"I wish this was the answer, but it creates one more level of bureaucracy," Manley told the 20 audience members during the panel on Sunday, Sept. 28 at Congregation Beth Am in Los Altos Hills. The event was organized by the local chapter of the League of Women Voters,

If passed, Prop. 5 would replace a similar initiative approved in 2000, Prop. 36. The

new measure would expand diversion and rehabilitation programs, decrease or increase parole time depending on the crime and provide opportunities for inmates to shorten prison sentences by participating in these programs. It would also decrease some legal penalties for possession of marijuana and limit judges from incarcerating offenders for breaking parole or drug treatments.

The proposition could cost over \$1 billion annually to expand treatment programs, but the state would save the same amount by not spending as much on correction operations, according to the Legislative Analyst's Office, a non-partisan organization that provides policy

and fiscal recommendations. The proposition also would create an estimated one-time savings of \$2.5 billion by not building additional prison space.

Prop. 5 comes as the California prison system experiences severe overcrowding. Gymnasiums have been converted to house some of the 171,000 adult inmates in state prisons. Proponents said Prop. 5 would relieve overcrowding by putting nonviolent drug offenders in rehab rather than behind bars.

"There is virtually no rehabilitation and then the offenders are released and told not to do it again," Egar said. "We need to provide the treatment."

The judges disagreed, saying the system does have treatment programs. Current drug court programs allow judges to send adult felons to mandatory rehabilitation programs instead of incarcerating them. Manley and Cole said these programs work by testing the felons regularly for drugs and making them accountable for their actions.

But Prop. 5 would largely replace drug courts, taking away this accountability and adding bureaucracy, they said. ▀



## PROP. 11 COULD CHANGE MAKEUP OF LEGISLATURE

Proposition 11, a redistricting measure on the November ballot, could potentially reshape California's political map.

Rather than having elected representatives determine California's district boundaries, the proposition would create a 14-member commission composed of registered voters to draw district lines for the state Assembly, state Senate and Board of Equalization. The commission, selected through a process involving government auditing and lottery, would be comprised of five Democrats, five Republicans and four of neither party.

Under the current Constitution, state legislators draw district maps for the state Assembly and Senate. Prop. 11 — the second redistricting reform initiative on the ballot in four years, and the eighth since 1982 — would amend the state Constitution.

In alignment with the statewide party, the Santa Clara County Democratic Party has spoken out against the initiative.

"The Democratic Party opposes Prop. 11 because we don't believe it is going to bring about reform and fairness that people want," said Steve Preminger, chair of the county group. "To do that, we need to revisit the two-thirds majority it takes to pass a budget, or to look to reforming

our term limit rule for state legislators."

The Santa Clara County Cities Association passed a resolution in support of the proposition in June. The board of directors voted unanimously after a presentation from nonpartisan groups supporting the measure, including Common Cause, League of Women Voters and AARP.

"Passing Prop. 11 will finally help us hold politicians accountable to addressing the issues important to Californians," said Janis Hirohama, president of the League of Women Voters in California. "Proposition 11 is about restoring the power to demand results out of Sacramento to the people to California."

Opponents argue that the measure would create unnecessary levels of bureaucracy, complicating the process further and putting power in the hands of those who cannot be held accountable by voters.

"We think that it is legitimate to have some reform. ... We just don't think that this method is [best]," said Preminger. "We also don't feel confident that there can be an independent board."

Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger has supported the measure, citing the need to end political gridlock. ▀

has been a resident of Mountain View for eight years and of the Bay Area for 25 years. She is enthusiastic about helping people find a home in Mountain View, and believes it gives her an intimate perspective on the city.

Wang is a supporter of the proposal for a new teen center in the city, and wants to maintain strong after-school programs for youth.

She said she would like to see more conveniently

located grocery stores and more mixed-use development.

In a unique proposal, Wang said she also would consider some form of rent control, possibly through a city incentive program, as a way to keep rents from rising.

Wang is a believer in the global economy, and said she could work to attract international investment in Mountain View. "I feel that I could attract some private or international investment," she says. "We cannot just count on Google. Those high-tech companies will fade away sooner or later." ▀

the measure on the ballot, the hospital must meet earthquake-safe regulations by 2013 or have its trauma and burn centers closed, along with a third of its beds. The county estimates that the cuts would mean facilities would not be able to serve 10,500 people each year.

SCVMC is a public hospital owned by the county, and is the only regional facility with a burn center.

If two-thirds of county voters approve Measure A, the county would issue and sell bonds to fund the renovations and to replace San Jose Medical Center, which was closed in 2004, with new facilities in downtown San Jose.

The measure also would require creation of a Citizens' Oversight Committee to oversee annual reports and expenditures, and funds from the measure could not go toward administrators' salaries.

No official arguments were filed against Measure A. ▀

**BLINDNESS** ★★★

(Century 16, Century 20) The resurrection of humanity is a touchy subject, uncomfortable on its surface and downright horrifying beneath. Such is the case for the residents of the edgy, unnamed Anytown where an epidemic of blindness known as the "white sickness" descends on a bewildered population. Psychosomatic or neurological? Scientists are at wits' end as the country falls into a state of crisis and victims are sent to camps housed in an abandoned mental asylum to fend for themselves. Among them is a brilliant eye doctor (Mark Ruffalo) whose 20/20 vision abandons him, and his seeing wife (Julianne Moore) who is inexplicably spared yet refuses to leave her husband behind. *Rated: R for violence, sexuality and very mature themes. 1 hour, 59 minutes.* — J.A.

**BURN AFTER READING** ★★★1/2

(Century 16, Century 20) Osborne Cox (John Malkovich) is a CIA analyst fired for a "drinking problem," at which point he comes totally unglued. His wife, Katie (Tilda Swinton), feels no pain as she's with U.S. Federal Marshal Harry Pfarer (George Clooney) on the side. Linda Litzke (Frances McDormand) frets over her insurance company's unwillingness to cough up the dough for cosmetic surgery. Hyperactive trainer Chad Feldheimer (Brad Pitt) is her shoulder to cry on. Opportunity knocks when a Hardbodies employee finds a CD of Osborne's tell-all memoirs. Believing they've struck gold, Chad and Linda attempt to blackmail him. *Rated: R for pervasive language, sexual content and violence. A taut 1 hour, 31 minutes.* — J.A.

During a routine flash rainstorm he hits on a great idea: intermittent windshield wipers that function much as the human eye does. With a great deal of enthusiasm and can-do naivete, the nutty professor takes his idea to the Ford
