This weekend is the last chance to see Pear Avenue Theatre's superb, saucy production of 'Way of the World'

First performed in 1700, William Congreve's comedy "The Way of the World" is one of a handful of English plays from the century following William Shakespeare's death that are still studied and occasionally staged today. Three hundred and nine years later, it has found its way to Mountain View, in an enthusiastic and well-paced production at the Pear Avenue Theatre.

"The Way of the World" is a story of passion, deception and intricate social maneuvering. Explaining the show's plot — even the bare bones of the plot — without diagrams, footnotes and finger puppets is nigh unto impossible, but the attempt must nonetheless be made.

Edward Mirabel wishes to marry Millamont, but has so offended her aunt, the widow Lady Wishfort, that Millamont stands to lose her inheritance if the pair wed. To overcome this obstacle, Mirabel has cooked up a scheme in which his valet, Waitwell (who has secretly married Lady Wishfort's maid, Foible), is to disguise himself as a wealthy suitor for Lady Wishfort's hand. Once the old woman marries Waitwell, Mirabel intends

to reveal her new husband's identity and offer to spare her from public humiliation in exchange for her blessing on his marriage to Millamont.

With quick thinking from Foible, the scheme may just succeed ... as long as Wishfort isn't tipped off by the conniving Mrs. Marwood, a supposed friend of Wishfort's daughter who is actually having an affair with the daughter's husband, Fainall. Fainall, for his part, is planning to gain control of Lady Wishfort's property himself (Millamont's inheritance included) by threatening an ugly divorce from her daughter.

Meanwhile, Wishfort has summoned her nephew, Sir Wilful Witwoud (a hard-drinking hayseed), with the intention of marrying Millamont off to him. And, throughout it all, buzzing around the fringes of these designs, are Wilful's foppish half-brother, Tony Witwoud, and Tony's dimwitted chum, Petulant.

So, to recap: A swarm of devious, over-sexed

characters with silly and alliterative names engage in a battle of wits, all hoping to lay claim to an old woman's fortune through some calculated perversion of the institution of marriage. Though Congreve's language is nearly as Shakespearean as Shakespeare's — even servants and fools speak in elegant similes and syllogisms — modern audiences may be surprised by how salaciously contemporary this all feels.

Indeed, director Rebecca J. Ennals has done what she can to emphasize the trash-TV aspect of the story. Scene-change music is all contemporary, and the prologue and epilogue (which the playwright obligingly wrote in rhyming couplets) are spoken in time to the hormonal thrum of a modern club groove.

Patricia Tyler's costumes are a sexy blend of Restoration-era couture and MTV chic: rich fabrics, hard-working bustiers, exposed bra straps, petticoats, denim breeches, pleather pants and outrageous wigs. The uncredited props department has created a slew of supermarket tabloids, all bearing photos of the show's characters with scandalous headlines blaring. It's an ingenious gimmick, driving home the self-obsessed decadence of a historical era that most Americans know nothing about.

Ennals uses another clever device in the show's opening scene. As Mirabell and Fainall sit chatting in a fashionable chocolate house (the Starbucks of its time), ladling out copious amounts of backstory, the play's other characters appear and disappear behind a scrim on an upstage platform, acting out the gossip as we hear it. By allowing the audience to attach faces to the unfamiliar names, it provides a foothold that keeps all that exposition from going to waste.

But all the clever direction and design work in the world couldn't make this three-hour show comprehensible — let alone enjoyable — if the acting wasn't up to snuff. It is a testament to The Pear's reputation that it was able to draw the talent needed to cast the show successfully.

The ensemble is composed of six men and five women, several with notable Shakespearean experi-

ence, most of whom play multiple roles. (In addition to the characters mentioned above, there are a number of servants, coachmen, etc., virtually all played in drag.) It is rare, in community theater, to find so large a cast with no weak spots, but this cast has none.

Furthermore, everyone involved seems to understand the heightened performance style that is required for Restoration comedy, and everyone handles the loquacious dialogue with apparent ease.

Roberta Morris is marvelously expansive as Lady Wishfort, one moment recoiling from her mirror, shrieking, "I am absolutely decayed!" and the next moment lounging coquettishly on the chaise in a glittering pink dress, a pink wig and fuchsia platform pumps.

As Millamont, Rami Margron is sly and spunky, especially when negotiating a pre-nup that would make Gloria Steinem smile. Margron and Joseph Salazar (Mirabell) have the unenviable task of making their duplicitous characters more likable than all the other duplicitous characters in the play. Their personal charisma and chemistry help a great deal, and Alex Kirschner (Fainall) and Carla Pantoja (Marwood) help them out by upping the villainy of the opposing team.

The rest of the superb cast is: Ray Renati (Tony Witwoud), Jim Johnson (Petulant), Paul Loomis (Wilfull), Shannon Warrick (Mrs. Fainall), William J. Brown III (Waitwell), and the delightful Annamarie MacLeod as Foible.

"The Way of the World" may not be everyone's cup of tea, but the Pear Avenue Theatre's production is as lively, laugh-packed and accessible as one could hope to find in such a small venue. ■

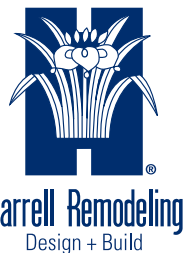

ANGELS AND DEMONS ★★ 1/2

(Century 16, Century 20) Tom Hanks reprises his role as ace Harvard symbologist Robert Langdon, whose knowledge of ancient Catholic history makes him ideally suited to the latest Vatican conflict. Once established the narrative kicks off a roundelay of hidden catacombs, high-tempo pursuits and medieval codes. Not to mention anxious cardinals in the throes of Conclave, a perky Pope's assistant (Ewan McGregor) and the rabidly conventional Swiss Guard led by Commander Richter (the consistently impressive Stellan Skarsgard). Director Ron Howard does not disappoint when it comes to popcorn thrills: frenetic chases, kinetic explosions and the kind of nine-lives scenarios that make for head-scratching contingencies. Not surprisingly, the plot — though stuffed with papal politics and conspiracy — is a one-dimensional affair loaded with commonplace distractions that never catch fire the way Dan Brown's prose managed so effortlessly (albeit outrageously) on the page. *Rated: PG-13 for violence, bloodshed and mature themes. 2 hours, 20 minutes.* — J.A.

EVERY LITTLE STEP ★★ 1/2

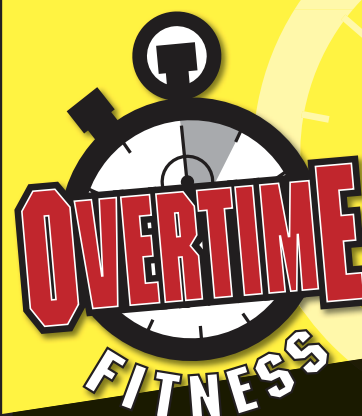
(Aquarius) The hit Broadway musical "A Chorus Line" deals with the gauntlet of an audition: a soul-baring performance for a small, judgmental audience, often with a paycheck at stake. So too does a new documentary film about the show and its 2006 Broadway revival: "Every Little Step." The 1975 play "A Chorus Line" memorably depicted dancers auditioning for a Broadway musical. "Every Little Step" devotes screen time to recounting the development of a play referred to as "every performer's story" and "the history of dance in theater." An oral history of the show includes comments from original co-choreographer Bob Avian, composer Marvin Hamlisch, original "Cassie" Donna McKechnie and original "Connie" Baayork Lee. As director and choreographer of the revival, respectively, Avian and Lee sit behind the audition table, their experience with the play making them especially discriminating and empathetic. *Rated PG-13 for some strong language and sexual references. One hour, 36 minutes.* — P.C.

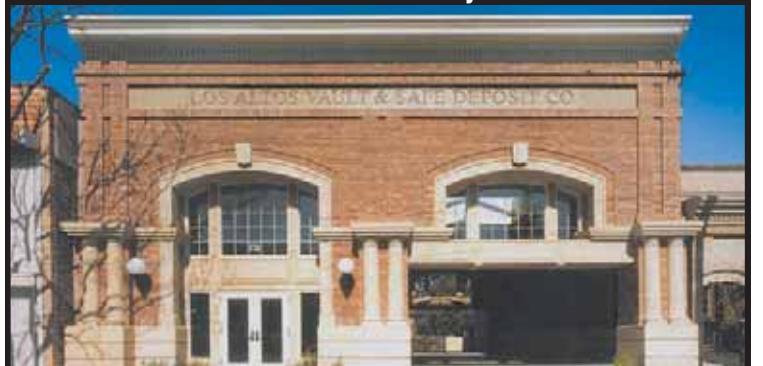

Daley (Ben Stiller) quit his job and got rich quick selling his own products on late-night infomercials. Upon visiting his old stomping grounds, Larry learns from museum director Dr. McPhee (Ricky Gervais) that all of the old exhibits are being shipped off to storage in Washington, D.C., to make way for interactive holographic replacements. The venue change to the Smithsonian provides the novelty as Larry tries to protect his friends from becoming the collateral damage of evil, lipslip pharaoh Kahmunrah (Hank Azaria). The Smithsonian gives Levy a new set of toys, including spunky Amelia Earhart (Amy Adams), the Lincoln Memorial and Rodin's "The Thinker" (both voiced by "Simpsons" vet Azaria), Archie Bunker's chair and "American Gothic," a Turner seascape and a display case full of Einstein bobbleheads. The story feels mechani-

cally engineered for special effect after special effect, all of them derivations of ideas we've seen before. But like its predecessor, "Night at the Museum: Battle of the Smithsonian" has one trump card: It's a kid-friendly, PG film that celebrates museums. *Rated PG for mild action and brief language. One hour, forty-five minutes.* — P.C.

RUDO Y CURSI ★★★1/2

(Cinearts) Diego Luna and Gael Garcia Bernal rekindle their chemistry in this charming cautionary fable of futbol-playing brothers. Beto and Tato Verduco are living life on the edge in rural Mexico. Beto (Luna) is an idealistic hothead making endless promises to his fed-up wife and kids. Tato (Bernal) is the charismatic clown, a gadabout living one day at a time in clueless obscurity. In true fairy-tale fashion an eager scout (Guillermo Francela) turns up at the dirt pitch where the boys take out their physical frustrations on the futbol-fren-

zied locals. He offers Tato a tryout with a professional team and somehow Tato makes the cut. Beto, consumed with jealousy over Tato's mercurial celebrity, leaves his family on a lark to make the rival team's starting lineup as their beloved keeper. Now it's mano a mano family-style, sans the brotherly love. *Rated: R for profanity, brief violence and nudity. 1 hour, 43 minutes. In Spanish with English subtitles.* — J.A.

STAR TREK ★★★1/2

Director J.J. Abrams and company have achieved quite a bit in reframing the future adventures of the explorers of Starfleet (a "peacekeeping and humanitarian armada"). The crew of the Enterprise includes Capt. Christopher Pike (Bruce Greenwood), first officer Spock (Zachary Quinto), communications officer Uhura (Zoe Saldana), Dr. Leonard "Bones" McCoy (Karl Urban), helmsman Hikaru Sulu (John Cho), navigator Chekov (Anton Yelchin), and the brash and unwelcome James T. Kirk

(Chris Pine), destined to follow in his father's footsteps to become a Starfleet captain (also on the fringes: Simon Pegg's Scottish starship engineer Montgomery Scott). Before the Enterprise takes its maiden voyage in response to a mysterious threat (involving Eric Bana's Romulan "war criminal" Nero), Abrams gets to work with some surprisingly rich and certified-fresh myth-building. It's a stroke of genius to conceive of Kirk and Spock as two rebels looking for a cause, who butt heads on the way to becoming lifelong friends. *Rated PG-13 for violence, sci-fi action and brief sexual content. Two hours, seven minutes.* P.C.

SUNSHINE CLEANING ★★1/2

(Cinearts) Rose Norkowski (Amy Adams) is between a rock and hard spot: shackling up with ex-high school squeeze and married cop Mac (Steve Zahn), raising a kid on her own and wasting her potential cleaning houses. A chance suggestion by Mac turns to gold when Rose

partners with sister Norah (Emily Blunt) to start her own crime-scene clean-up company, aptly named Sunshine Cleaning. Adams has the chops, bringing a fresh spin to deep hurts and a spark to her determination to get things right. Blunt plays off her with ease — two hot actresses on their inevitable paths to greatness. But the narrative has trouble balancing its dark tones and its peculiar humor, never finding a comfortable niche. *Rated: R for language, gore and sexuality. 1 hour, 42 minutes.* — J.A.

TERMINATOR SALVATION ★★

(Century 16, Century 20) What began in 1984 with director James Cameron's creative and compelling actioner that introduced the world to Arnold Schwarzenegger has devolved into a generic science-fiction franchise rich in style but bereft of soul. The year is 2018, and the hopeless, war-torn future Sarah Connor so aggressively tried to alter has come to pass. Sarah's son John (Bale) is now a key member of humankind's resistance against Skynet and its mass army of killer machines. The Resistance finds an unusual ally in former death-row inmate Marcus Wright (Sam Worthington), a Skynet-developed cyborg who refuses to relinquish his humanity. Wright teams with teenager Kyle Reese (Anton Yelchin), the young man destined to become John Connor's father, and deaf adolescent Star (newcomer Jadagrace) as machines blast away buildings and bodies with impunity. *Rated: PG-13 for intense sequences of sci-fi violence and action and language. 2 hours, 10 minutes.* — T.H.

X-MEN ORIGINS: WOLVERINE ★★★

(Century 16, Century 20) The story focuses on the relationship between brothers Wolverine (aka Logan) and Sabretooth (aka Victor Creed), from their adolescence to wartime heroics to involvement in the controversial Weapon X program. After being sacrificed to a firing squad Wolverine and Sabretooth are approached by General William Stryker (Danny Huston). Stryker convinces the men to join a team of tough mutants that includes sharpshooter Agent Zero (Daniel Henney), brawler Fred Dukes (Kevin Durand) and wisecracking mercenary Wade Wilson (Ryan Reynolds), aka Deadpool. It turns out Stryker has sinister intentions and Wolverine is fortunate to survive the adamantium infusion. As Wolverine endeavors to dismantle Stryker's nefarious program, he turns to fellow mutants for help. Overall, the movie is not unlike the character himself: Rough around the edges but memorable nonetheless. *Rated: PG-13 for violence, intense sequences of action and some partial nudity. 1 hours, 47 minutes.* — T.H.

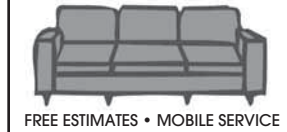

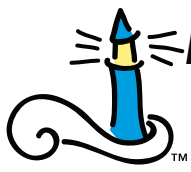

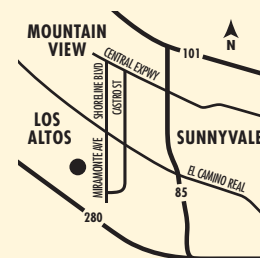
