## Eshoo buys time for Hangar

There may be hope for Hangar One after all, city officials say, after Congresswoman Anna Eshoo negotiated with the Navy to delay plans to strip the structure for 30 days.

The Navy, NASA Ames and the city of Mountain View have been debating the future of Hangar One for years. But discussions were at a relative standstill over the past several weeks after Navy officials announced they had resolved once and for all to strip the historic structure's toxic siding away and leave a bare skeleton behind — an option preservationists said would spell the end for the hangar. Before its discussions with Eshoo, the Navy reportedly was trying to enter into a contract by the end of the month to remove the siding.

## Time to 'reboot' California?

Several hundred local civic leaders, including more than two dozen selected officials, gathered in Sunnyvale last week to talk about "rebooting California."

Organizers proposed a constitutional convention to "take back California" from a "crumbling infrastructure, overflowing prisons, failing schools and a dysfunctional legislature."

"We're at a very critical moment in the history of California," said Jim Wunderman, CEO of the Bay Area Council, a business-sponsored advocacy group. "Are we going to take California forward

## Cyclist rode past cancer and kept going

HE'S NOT ARMSTRONG, BUT MOUNTAIN VIEW'S DAVID TROUSDALE IS RACKING UP PODIUM FINISHES OF HIS OWN

Earlier this summer, a cancer survivor cycled past the competition and finished high on the podium. No, not Lance Armstrong. This cyclist was Mountain View resident David Trousdale, and his podium finish was not at the Tour de France, but the California Senior Games.

Though Armstrong's third place finish enthralled many, Trousdale placed much higher on his podium. He placed first in the 5-kilometer time trial and in the 20K and 40K races, and second in the 10K time trial.

Now Trousdale, 65, is bringing those medals to Palo Alto to compete in the 2009 Summer National Senior Games.

Despite the obvious comparison to another winning cyclist who survived cancer, Trou-

sdale said Armstrong is not his idol.

"Everybody knows about Lance, but I like

to follow other riders," he said.

Trousdale said Fabian Cancellara was a

rider he admired and studied. Still, Trousdale's wife, Sherry Symington, is fond of calling her husband "The Lance Armstrong of Mountain View."

Trousdale said he has been riding bicycles his whole life, but it was not until three years ago that he began cycling competitively. In fact, competitive cycling was not even Trousdale's first choice. He initially was going to train to be a sprinter, but his knees began hurting. A sports physician suggested he try cycling, and that was the launch of his cycling career.

Since switching to cycling, Trousdale has been a dedicated competitor. He has competed in the California Senior Games for the past three years and has also participated in

## Caltrain promises to reduce horn volume

Following an outcry from Peninsula residents who live near the tracks, Caltrain plans to reduce the volume of its locomotives' horns back to a level residents are accustomed to, a Caltrain spokesperson said last Friday. She estimated the change will take two to three weeks to implement.

In mid-July, the rail agency had moved the horns from the undercarriage of the cars to the top to allow them to make the proper sequence of sounds, according to spokesperson Christine Dunn. The horns will remain at the tops of the trains, but the rail agency plans to install a regulator that would allow it to "finely tune" the volume, Dunn said.

The horns will sound in four distinct blows, rather than one continuous honk, according to Dunn.

People who live along the tracks have inundated the rail agency with letters and calls, sent angry missives to city council members, and spilled their frustration in online forums. Some have speculated that Caltrain increased the volume in response to several people who have committed suicide on the tracks in recent months. Others alleged that Caltrain was trying to sway public opinion in favor of the high-speed rail system, which would not necessitate a horn because of the grade separations.

Dunn denied both claims, saying that this was simply a matter of complying with federal regulations.

Engineers are required to sound the horn a quarter-mile before each grade crossing — places where a street crosses the tracks — or if they see someone on or close to the tracks, Dunn said. ■

## Local man gives the ultimate gift

VIVEK KUMAR TWICE SAVED A STRANGER'S LIFE BY SHARING HIS STEM CELLS

Vivek Kumar knew nothing about the patient, except she was a 38-year-old woman dying of leukemia, when he decided to save her life the first time.

The Mountain View resident is part of a national registry, Be the Match, which pairs patients who suffer from leukemia or other blood diseases with someone who has a matching human leukocyte antigen — "a protein

found on the surface of cells that are involved in the body's defense mechanism," according to the registry. These matching antigens allow the participants to donate either bone marrow or stem cells, and ultimately help save a life.

Kumar donated his stem cells to the woman in 2008, and then again recently, after her leukemia returned.

A 32-year-old native of India who now works as a product marketing manager for a

local semiconductor company, Kumar became involved with the registry through the Asian American Donor Program (AADP), an East Bay nonprofit which works to increase the number of Asian Americans and other minorities who sign up on the registry. People can only be matches for patients of the same race.

He said there are relatively few people of Asian descent on

## Advocates: Teen center would reduce city's crime

Gang violence and general crime will be substantially reduced if the city opens a larger and better teen center — that was the message put forth by a group of youth and youth advocates at a community meeting last week.

The city recently purchased Rock Church, located on Escuela Avenue, and members of Youth Motivated for Action and Involvement (YMAI), part of the advocacy group Peninsula Interfaith Action, want to turn it into a teen center. So they held a public meeting at St Joseph Church on Thursday, July 30 to discuss the need for a teen center in Mountain View.

At the meeting, several local teens, including some who have been involved with gangs and crime, said a center would give youth a place to hang out and a sense of belonging. In effect, they said, it would keep them off the streets.

"We are here today because we have listened to our community leaders of tomorrow and they need a safe place today," YMAI member Diana Marin told the 50 community members who gathered at St Joseph.

YMAI has been pushing for a teen center for three years. Members of the group say the city's current teen center, located on Escuela Avenue next to the Senior Center, is only open two evenings a week and

## Leadership Mountain View celebrates 20 years

CHAMBER PROGRAM HELPS RESIDENTS DISCOVER WHAT MAKES CITY TICK

Laura Blakely lived in Mountain View for a decade, but it wasn't until participating in Leadership Mountain View that she really got to know the city.

Each year Leadership Mountain View, a nonprofit run by the Chamber of Commerce, brings together several dozen people who live or work in the

city to help them learn about what makes Mountain View function — from its City Hall to its schools, businesses and nonprofits.

"I was interested in learning more about the city and becoming a leader," said Blakely, who volunteers in the elementary school district. "I learned so much about how dif-

ferent agencies come together."

LMV's classes — which have graduated council members, school administrators, business leaders and nonprofit directors — span nearly two decades now, and next week is the deadline to sign up for the program's 20th class. The milestone will be celebrated when this class gradu-



ates in the spring, and 500 alumni will reunite to celebrate the 20th anniversary, said the program's current director, Alicia Crank.

The approximately 30 participants in each class meet one Friday a month for nine months to become more acquainted with the city and find ways to get more involved.

the registry, although the number is growing.

"When people are looking for a match this is their only hope," Kumar said of the registry. "How often do I get a chance to save someone's life?"

When AADP started 20 years ago, there were 123 registered Asian-Americans and 300,000 registered Caucasians on Be the Match, according to AADP executive director Carol Gillespie. Today there are 7.4 million people registered worldwide, and 532,000 of these are Asian-Americans.

**Campaigning**

Kumar first joined the registry in 2001 after seeing an AADP booth at an Indian charity race at Shoreline Park. He had just finished running, and decided to give an antigen sample right there.

To register, Gillespie said, participants need to fill out a consent form. Their cheeks are then swabbed, and they are listed on the registry.

There have been 20,000 stem cell donations in the last 20 years in the United States, Gillespie said.

"It's like trying to find your identical twin," she said of finding

a match. "It's very difficult."

It took six years until Kumar was matched as a donor. In the meantime, he said, he had forgotten about the registry until he saw a mass e-mail in April 2005 about a 6-year-old boy in Michigan who was dying of leukemia. Kumar was so touched by the story that he started trying to find matches for the boy.

He held 20 drives in six weeks. The boy found a match, but died later that year. Kumar said he was able to register someone else, who also matched up with a sick patient and donated.

"All that running around helped," Kumar said.

Because of his good work for the group, Kumar was asked to be on the board of advisors of AADP.

**The call**

Kumar's call finally came in 2007. There was a woman who needed his stem cells to survive, and Kumar donated for the first time in 2008.

The program is confidential, and the donor learns very little about the patient. Kumar only knows the age, gender and illness of the women, whose life he has now saved twice.

"I never thought about it twice," he said. "It was an honor."

"He is giving because he is a generous person," Gillespie said. "It's quite amazing."

"Not only has he given life once, but twice," she added.

To extract liquid marrow, a needle is inserted into the pelvic bone. The donor receives anesthesia, and may be sore in his or her lower back for several days. The bone marrow grows back in four to six weeks, Gillespie said.

For stem cell removal, Kumar received shots for five days leading up to the procedure, in order to boost "the stem cells produced and move them into the blood stream," he said.

The shots gave Kumar some flu-like symptoms, and he ached a bit, but was able to control it using Tylenol. He said he even performed in a dance production after receiving the shots.

After five days of shots, Kumar was hooked up to a machine which extracts blood and separates the stem cells. The blood is then returned to his body. It's a six- to eight-hour procedure, but a mostly painless one, according to Kumar. His wife sat with him, and he was able to check his e-mail and play with his phone.

"It is relatively inconvenient," Kumar said. "Besides (the fact that) you get to save someone's life."

# DA won't seek death penalty for Mountain View man

JING HUA WU ACCUSED OF TRIPLE MURDER AT SANTA CLARA COMPANY LAST NOVEMBER

Santa Clara County District Attorney Dolores Carr announced last week that she will not seek the death penalty against a Mountain View man accused of killing three colleagues at a Santa Clara semiconductor company last fall.

Jing Hua Wu, 47, was charged with three counts of murder, with a special allegation on each count that he personally used a firearm, as well as a special circumstance charge of killing multiple victims, according to Deputy District Attorney Jeff Rosen.

On Nov. 14, 2008, Wu was fired from his job as an engineer in testing and production at SiPort Inc., which makes chips for high-definition radios.

He returned later that afternoon and shot three people: SiPort CEO Sid Agrawal, 56, of Fremont; vice president of operations Brian Pugh, 47, of Los Altos; and human

resources manager Marilyn Lewis, 67, of San Jose.

If convicted of all charges, Wu could face up to life in prison without the possibility of parole.

The special circumstance charge made Wu eligible for the death penalty. However, after reviewing witness statements and physical evidence, and taking into account input from the families of the three victims, among other considerations, Carr decided not to seek the death penalty.

"While this case involves the murder of three innocent victims, we took into consideration the feelings of the victims' families, the defendant's lack of criminal history prior to the murders, and the likelihood of a jury returning a death verdict against the defendant," Carr said in a statement released last Thursday.

"Under these circumstances, a sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole is an appropriate sentence," she said. ■

### DETAINED MAN TRIED TO LIGHT COP CAR ON FIRE, POLICE SAY

Mountain View police have arrested a man for allegedly trying to light the back seat of a police car on fire — the very car in which he was being detained — while police searched his own car for illegal drugs.

On Thursday, July 30, an officer pulled over 21-year-old Christian Segarini of San Mateo for a traffic violation at the Highway 101 on-ramp at Moffett Boulevard. His passenger, 23-year-old Ricci Wynne of San Mateo, was holding "marijuana in plain view," said police spokesperson Liz Wylie.

Officers detained both of the men in separate police cars while they searched Segarini's vehicle. The men had not yet been arrested, and were not handcuffed, Wylie said.

While in the back seat, Segarini tried to light the area behind the seat on fire using a lighter, Wylie said. There was minor damage to the police car.

He was arrested on charg-

es of attempted arson, and Wynne, who had "large quantities" of marijuana, Wylie said, was arrested on charges of possessing the drug with intent to sell.

### MAN ROBS 7-ELEVEN AT KNIFEPOINT

Mountain View police are looking for a man who they say used a knife to rob a 7-Eleven store on Old Middlefield Road last week.

According to spokesperson Liz Wylie, the man entered the 7-Eleven, located at 1951 Old Middlefield Road, at around 4 a.m. on Tuesday, July 28. He brandished a knife and demanded money from the clerk, making off on foot with a small amount of cash, Wylie said.

The man is described as Latino and in his 20s. He is around 5-foot-5 and was wearing all black, including a hooded sweatshirt which covered his face, Wylie said.

The case remains under investigation. Anyone with information is urged to call (650) 903-6344.

does not offer enough services for youth.

After buying the church last month for \$3.5 million, City Council members said they could use it as a second parking lot for the Senior Center. They have not ruled out other uses.

"I live 30 feet from the Senior Center and I have never seen the parking lot full," Denise Olmos said during the hour-long meeting.

Her brother Eddie Olmos, who has been heading the campaign for a teen center for the last three and a half years, started the meeting by asking community members if they knew anyone who had been involved in a gang, or had been killed because of gang-related activities. Most of those present — children, adults and seniors — raised their hands.

Edwin Zuniga, a Los Altos High School student, said YMAI gave him a sense of belonging and purpose, and helped him change his life.

"I have a little sister and I don't want her to follow in my footsteps going through gangs," he said.

"I started changing when I first joined this group. I realized how much we needed a teen center."

YMAI member Anna McMaster said that many of the city's crimes, such as auto theft and burglary, are connected to gang activity. Six of the 10 homicides from 2000 to 2008 were gang-related, she said.

The city and Police Department have some programs in place for at-risk youth, McMaster said, but "it wasn't enough."

No City Council members attended the meeting, but Mayor Margaret Abe-Koga sent a letter.

Abe-Koga told the *Voice* last week that the council has not made any decisions on how to use the new property, and will probably begin discussing the issue this fall after members return from summer recess. She added that she supported the purchase of the property and that her "priority" is using it as a teen center.

However, she said, the city is still leasing the church to its congregation until June 2011, which means teen activities there would have to happen "during non-church hours." ■

"It exposes people to how the city works. This is a way for people to see how they want to become more involved," Crank said.

The program is a great way to network, and many participants stay in touch after the course. This year's class will kick things off with a meeting at the Microsoft campus, where they will participate in team-building exercises.

"I made good friends in the Police Department and the library," said Kathi Lilga, executive assistant to the elementary school district superintendent. "I highly encourage people to do it."

Later in the year, the group will tour City Hall and listen to guest speakers, mostly city employees, during a forum at the library. During another class, the Community School of Music and Arts and KMVT, the local television station, are on the agenda.

"Participants learn what kind of opportunities are out there," Crank said. "Each time you come, there will be a different experience."

The program costs \$1,750, but Crank said many businesses pay for their employees to attend. Both local school districts have sent at least one employee a year

in the past. The nonprofit also raises funds to help people who have to pay out of pocket.

"We never want finances to be an issue," Crank said.

This is Crank's first year as program director, and besides planning the 20-year reunion, she hopes to implement new activities, such as a mentoring program pairing current participants with alumni.

"Someone who came through the class several years ago had different experiences than someone going through it this year," she said.

Crank said many cities have similar programs, but Mountain View's is unique because of NASA Ames and all the big businesses located here. She hopes to capitalize on this, for example, by organizing a "class trip" to NASA. ■

Earlier this week, Eshoo sent out a press release saying that after meeting with Secretary of the Navy Ray Mabus, he had agreed to “delay any action for 30 days to determine a mutually acceptable solution for both NASA Ames and the city of Mountain View.”

“Both the Secretary and the Undersecretary understand the history and significance of Hangar One and are willing to examine

new avenues to facilitate its restoration and reuse,” Eshoo said in the press release. “I am eager to move forward with NASA and the Navy so that together, we will find the right solution.”

On Wednesday, city manager Kevin Duggan applauded the development, though he remained cautiously optimistic.

“We view the delay as good. But it is not a solution. What is critical now is that a solution needs to be reached,” he said. “The patient is very much at risk.”

Duggan, who calls the hangar

an “iconic structure,” said the city plans to join in the discussion and “will get more involved if a contact comes up.”

The more delay the better, he added, because once arrangements are made for re-covering the hangar — arrangements which have been elusive so far — the whole process will be easier and less expensive if it’s done right after the Navy removes the toxic siding.

Last month, Mountain View City Council members sent a letter to the Navy saying that “the skin should not be removed until a plan was in

place to replace it,” Duggan said.

“We were concerned,” he said, that “when the Navy made a contract, we would be at a point of no return.”

Navy and NASA Ames representatives were not immediately available for comment.

Others who have closely watched the debate over the hangar’s fate also said they were happy with the Navy’s decision to hold off for 30 days.

“It certainly looks encouraging,” said Bob Moss, co-chair of the Moffett Field Restoration Advisory Board.

NASA inherited Moffett Field

from the Navy in 1993, but environmental cleanup of the site, including the hangar, is still the Navy’s responsibility. The Navy put a protective coating on the hangar’s outer panels after dangerous PCBs and other chemicals were found to be leaching from the siding. Although the coating has worked as a stopgap measure, experts say the hangar will eventually start releasing toxins once more. ▀

or let it slip back into mediocrity?

“People say a constitutional convention sounds like a great leap, it’s a little bit scary, we could make things worse. What I say is, if you really want to be scared about something you should be scared of the status quo,” Wunderman said.

Backers, meeting last Friday at Advanced Micro Devices in Sunnyvale, said they are creating a movement fueled by small donations styled after the presidential campaign of Barack Obama.

They outlined a scenario in which randomly selected citizens reflecting California’s demographics would meet to address “systemic problems.” Discussion would be confined to budget, election reform, governance and the state-local fiscal relationship.

Santa Clara County Assessor Larry Stone told the group he has “reluctantly concluded” a constitutional convention is the only way to fix a state government responsive to moneyed interests and loud voices over sound public policy.

“We still have time to turn this ship around from the iceberg,” Stone said, calling for a complete overhaul of the state’s tax structure, education code and campaign finance laws.

“The money chase is perverting our democracy,” Stone said.

While several speakers argued that Proposition 13 has wreaked havoc on the state in ways never intended, Wunderman warned against taking aim at the 1978 property-tax-cutting initiative, which remains popular.

Only 17 percent of Californians want to see it changed, according to a poll taken last year by the Public Policy Institute of California, Wunderman said.

“There’s a lot of opportunity to work on the system we have without having to repeal Proposition 13,” he said.

Derek Cressman, western states director for the good-government group Common Cause, said a convention would be an opportunity to fix system problems in a “package deal” with fair tradeoffs rather than a piecemeal approach.

Several argued that Proposition 13 and the two-thirds requirement to pass a budget are essential protections against politicians who lack long-term fiscal discipline.

The state’s budget catastrophe was self-inflicted by legislators who seized on 1990s surpluses to bind the state to unsustainable payouts, said Bob Hines of the Silicon Valley Leadership Group.

Today’s “structural deficit” is driven by cost-of-living adjustments in entitlement programs and

pension contributions, Hines said.

Supervisor Liz Kniss, who represents Mountain View in the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors, said the initiative process has tied the hands of legislators by creating state obligations without identifying how they will be paid for.

“You can put any initiative on the ballot you want and it doesn’t have to have any indication of where the money will come from,” Kniss said. “Initiatives have shaped the entire state budget to the point now where (legislators) have very little control over a very small amount of money.”

Lawyer Andrew Giacomini of the San Francisco firm Hanson Bridgett outlined the “nuts and bolts” of calling a convention in 2011, including a Sept. 25 deadline for submitting language to state Attorney General Jerry Brown before collecting 2 million signatures.

Repair California, an organization started by Wunderman, is holding “town hall” meetings similar to last Friday’s gathering up and down the state (the next meeting is Tuesday, Aug. 11 in San Francisco). Wunderman believes the state Legislature likely would be spurred to action if Repair California’s efforts are successful. ▀

the Nevada Senior Games and the Huntsman World Senior Games.

Trousdale trains for 10 to 12 hours each week on his bike, in addition to stretching and strength training. He also combines his physical training with a technological approach, using computers and experimentation to improve his times.

“I have a very sophisticated bicycle computer that collects all kinds of data from my bike, and then I use that and study it to develop my training — where my weaknesses are, where my strengths are,” Trousdale said.

Trousdale uses his bicycle’s computer to measure the amount of force he applies against the wind,

which he analyzes to improve his aerodynamics. He said that 85 percent of a cyclist’s effort is fighting wind resistance. Thus, slight improvements to his aerodynamics can greatly decrease his energy exertion.

The 2009 National Senior Games, now being held at Stanford, will be Trousdale’s first, so he enters it with two simple goals: “to have a good time” and “to do my best.” Trousdale said he has spent most of his time training and has made his top priority the 5K time trial.

“I’m hoping I do really well in the 5K. That’s where I’m really going to go all-out,” he said.

Despite being 65 years old, Trousdale insists he has not reached his prime in cycling yet.

“I’m improving,” he said. “I’m told for this type of sport, endur-

ance sports, that it takes five years to reach your prime.”

With three years of competitive cycling under his belt, that would put Trousdale at his prime in the 2011 National Senior Games.

“I seem to do personal bests each time,” Trousdale said. “When I do the same course, my times continue to get better, so I don’t think I’ve reached my prime yet.” ▀

## Caltrain hears the noise

Perhaps proving that its organization is nimble enough to hear and respond to public concerns, Caltrain announced last week that it will reduce the decibel level of horns on its locomotives running through the Peninsula rail corridor.

Three weeks ago, the agency made the questionable decision to move those horns from the bottom of its engines to the top, thereby increasing the noise level of the trains as they moved through intersections — and catching the ire of hundreds of people living, working or traveling near the tracks.

The change brought about an outcry from residents so strong that it prompted at least one city, Menlo Park, to issue a news release explaining that the volume of the horns was out of their control. Many residents said the additional noise was almost unbearable.

But Caltrain heard the complaints, and said it will reduce the volume of the horns back to the level of a few weeks ago, which over the years has been accepted by most local residents. A spokesperson said the change will take two to three weeks to implement.

The agency said the horns originally were moved when it was discovered during a routine safety inspection that they were not producing the “distinct, separate, sequential blasts (tweet and toot)” that is required by federal regulations.”

At that point, residents found themselves caught in the netherworld of railroad bureaucracy over the arcane definitions of a “tweet” and a “toot,” nomenclature likely dreamed up years ago by an employee of the Federal Railroad Administration. No federal inspector was involved in the decision to pump up the volume, which had been at a lower level for nearly a decade.

Caltrain should never have bothered moving the horns in the first place without first consulting the federal railroad agency and at least notifying cities and residents in advance. In this, the agency made a major error in judgment that, before this episode is over, will have unnecessarily subjected thousands of Peninsula residents to more than a month of over-the-top tweets and toots.

Federal rules require trains to sound the horn one-quarter of a mile before each of the 44 grade crossings on the Peninsula route. With 50 trains or more making the round trip between San Francisco and San Jose (and some going on to Gilroy), this adds up to more than 4,000 “tweets and toots” every weekday.

We're glad that, by reducing the horns to their prior decibel levels, Caltrain still will be able to meet its federal guidelines and maintain a required level of safety. In fact, some have questioned whether the trains actually need such high-powered horns in the first place, especially since every intersection is protected by crossing guards.

The answer to that question must come from the Federal Railroad Administration, and it is unlikely to come soon. In the meantime, those who live near the tracks can be thankful that their concerns were heard.

The horn volume and blowing is excessive. Suicidal people do not get hit and killed because the horn wasn't loud enough. Ridiculous. The lights and bells and lowered gates are enough to let anyone who cares know that a train is coming.

Secondly, Caltrain keeps parrotting the 44 grade crossing it has to blow at. Has anyone actually noticed that Caltrain blows the horn entering and leaving Mountain View from the south? For what grade crossing might they misdirect blame on the government for? While the 44 grade crossings may be true, this appears to be a complete misdirection of the facts.

Thirdly, in press statements they claim the horn must be sounded a quarter mile before all of these crossings. In reality it is illegal to sound it more than a quarter mile ahead. Sloppy grammar? It would be but this is just what Caltrain does.

I'm all for safety and proper horn noise but this safety program appears to be bungled by incompetence and half truths.

## We'll be havin' some fun

FOR THREE DECADES, THE BOARDWALK HAS BEEN LOS ALTOS' COOL, CLASSIC BURGER JOINT

It's telling that, on my first visit to The Boardwalk, I drove right past it and had to double back. Buried within a nondescript stretch of El Camino Real between San Antonio Road and Ortega Avenue, The Boardwalk, despite its enormous sign, blends into the office building where the restaurant resides, which itself disappears among the other office parks that line the block.

It was equally significant to find the parking lot crowded with cars every time I ate there. With no advertising and an undesirable location, how can it attract so many people willing to

stand in a long line for a burger, fries and a cold beer?

Easy. It's all done by word of mouth, an approach that has worked well for the Tougas family, the joint's owners 1975.

If The Boardwalk — with its dark interior, stained glass, eccentric wire sculptures, big wooden booths and burgers sizzling on the grill — is reminiscent of The Oasis in Menlo Park or The Garret in Campbell, that's because the Tougas family owns them, too. They know a good thing when they see one.

And the best thing about The Boardwalk is its utter lack of pre-

- 4 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 3 cloves chopped garlic
- 3 ripe, chopped roma tomatoes
- 2 tablespoons fresh chopped Italian parsley
- 16 oz. package penne pasta
- ½ teaspoon crushed red pepper
- 1 pound medium shrimp-peeled and deveined
- Salt
- Grated pecorino or Parmigiano Reggiano cheese

### Preparation instructions:

Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. Preheat olive oil on high heat. To the hot oil add garlic and crushed red pepper - cook until translucent. Reduce heat to medium and add tomatoes and salt. Cook uncovered for five minutes and then add shrimp, tossing to thoroughly coat shrimp. Continue cooking until shrimp is cooked and tomatoes soften and give up their juices about 5 minutes. While sauce is cooking, add pasta to boiling water and cook to "al dente" - penne should still be somewhat firm after cooking. Drain penne and pour into a warm serving bowl. Pour the sauce over the pasta, add the grated cheese and gently stir sauce to cover the penne. Sprinkle with chopped parsley. Serves 4-5

tense. For example, it has no wait staff; you fetch your own napkins, silverware and bottle of ketchup. Tables remain un-bussed a bit longer than you might expect. And yet every employee was exceptionally friendly and seemed genuinely happy. So we cued up next to the long wooden bar and squinted at the hand-painted menu hovering over the open kitchen across the room, waiting for our turn to order.

We started with the escargot bourguignon and foie gras — oops, wrong restaurant review! Instead we dove into a super-sized basket of onion rings

(\$2.46) brimming with real hand-battered golden O's. Warm to the touch but not lip-scorchingly so, ours offered the sugary zing of pungent sweet onion slices quick-fried in crispy corn batter. Accompanied by cooling ranch dressing, they were delicately oily and biting without being overcooked.

In an effort to offset the guilt we'd feel after devouring the fatty food yet to come, we tried a Caesar salad (\$4.25), and found no surprises: chopped lettuce, croutons, slivered parmesan cheese and a dressing that gladly didn't skimp on anchovies. Next

time, though, I'll ask them to go lighter on the dressing, as our lettuce was drenched.

I'll also steer clear of the soup of the day if it happens to be French onion (\$2.85 cup/\$4.25 bowl). It had much going for it — thick with sweet, translucent onion slices in a dark beefy broth — but neither croutons nor gruyere melted on top, and was so salty I couldn't finish it. In fact, almost every dish we tried was very salty. Low-sodium dieters pay heed.

Hamburger fans should consider Boardwalk's burger of the month. We took the plunge with the jalapeno burger (\$7.25), a generously sized homemade patty on a bun dressed with an onion slice and lettuce (you finish off the fixin's at the condiment bar in the middle of the dining room, but don't expect much more than ketchup and a couple different kinds of mustard). However, the magic was in the meat, which was juicy, medium done and riddled with chopped jalapenos that enlivened every bite.

I've long said that I've never had a cheese steak on the West Coast that can match those served within Philadelphia city limits. And after trying The Boardwalk's version (\$7.75), I still haven't — but it was darned close. Their chef overstuffs a soft French roll with juicy, finely diced beef, provolone cheese and caramelized sliced onions that were tumbled on the grill into a delicious goop. It was simple and irresistible.

The Boardwalk scored even bigger points with its small pizza with pepperoni and black olives (\$12.95). Again, while they didn't reinvent the wheel here, they did assemble a fine pie with a medium-thick crust that was crunchy instead of chewy, piled with melted cheese oozing over veggies and meat, and a yummy spicy-sweet tomato sauce that elicited a slight pucker. Even better, it still tasted great reheated the next day — the true test.

The place was packed last Saturday, hosting an all-girls water polo team and their parents. The party faced their chairs toward the Giants game screaming from wide-screen TVs behind the bar. Hollers went up whenever a runner scored or batter struck out. The kids were having a ball as the parents unwound.

And then it hit me: The Boardwalk isn't a restaurant. It's a community dining room where you can let your hair down at the end (or the middle) of the day. You feel like you're at home with family, and for that alone, it's a treasure. ■

**(500) DAYS OF SUMMER ★★★ 1/2**

(Century 16) The playful Generation Y story "(500) Days of Summer" goes against the romantic-comedy grain. Boy meets girl. Boy thinks he understands girl. Boy oh boy. The film takes the male point of view; that's not to say that Zooey Deschanel doesn't get a good role. But we follow the psychological roller coaster of Tom (Joseph Gordon-Levitt). When he strikes up an office romance with Deschanel's Summer, we've been warned. Not only have we seen Tom distraught from their eventual breakup, but the film's narrator has told us, "You should know up front: This is not a love story." The film's brilliant gimmick is to flip through the 500 days of the relationship as if they were in a Rolodex. With the added resonance of this technique and very funny observational humor, screenwriters Scott Neustadter and Michael H. Weber add insight to the old "boy meets girl" formula. *Rated PG-13 for sexual material and language. One hour, 35 minutes.* — P.C.

**FUNNY PEOPLE ★★★**

(Century 16, Century 20) Focused on one man's journey through the psychological perils of show-biz, "Funny" spins a yarn of mega-famous comedian George Simmons (Adam Sandler) who's at the top of his game when he is diagnosed with acute myeloid leukemia. A wake-up call, to be sure, and George is clueless about where to turn next. He begins by turning back to his roots and doing small sets at L.A.'s Improv Club, giving a sober look-see to the young talent coming up the ranks. One of those fledgling funny men is Ira Wright (Seth Rogen), who George taps to write some jokes for his next big gig. One gag leads to another and Ira finds himself as George's personal assistant: working material, fetching drinks and talking his boss to sleep in his cavernous megamansion. Cars, girls, private jets and cash; it's a heady but lonely existence. Wanting to right the wrongs of his past, George requests audiences with snubbed friends and family members, and re-connects with ex-love Laura (Leslie Mann). *Rated: R for language, crude humor and sexuality. Two hours, 20 minutes.* — J.A.

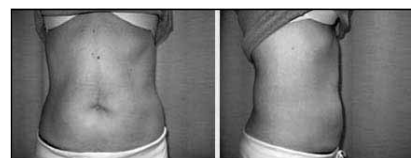

(Century 16, Century 20) Based on the penultimate novel of J.K. Rowling's seven-novel series, director David Yates' second "Harry Potter" film makes Rowling's characters and environs yet richer and deeper with (coming of) age. Hogwarts headmaster Albus Dumbledore (Michael Gambon) focuses on preparing Harry (Daniel Radcliffe) for the task of defeating evil. The key to defeating dark wizard Voldemort is a memory locked away in the mind of his former Potions professor Horace Slughorn (Jim Broadbent, brilliant here), who reluctantly agrees to return to his post at Hogwarts. As Harry plies for Slughorn's secret, the school is thick with romantic entanglements. Harry's best friends Hermione (Emma Watson) and Ron (Rupert Grint) are meant for each other, though they haven't yet acknowledged what's apparent to Harry; meanwhile, Harry pines for Ron's sister Ginny (Bonnie Wright). *Rated PG for scary images, some violence, language and mild sensuality. Two hours, 33 minutes.* — P.C.

**THE HURT LOCKER** ★★☆☆1/2  
(CineArts) Films about the Iraq War have shown box-office hoodoo, but director Kathryn Bigelow locates in "The Hurt Locker" both the expected and unexpected drama of an Army bomb

squad in 2004 Baghdad. Bigelow immediately establishes her action dynamics and inhospitable setting in a gripping opening sequence of Bravo Company going about its work of locating, sizing up and defusing IEDs. One member of the company will not survive, which opens the door for Staff Sgt. William James (Jeremy Renner) to join the team. Despite his precise skill, he's exasperatingly cavalier, and his disregard of safety protocols can be taken as no-nonsense or pure nonsense, depending on one's point of view. To James' shaken colleagues, their new commander is himself a ticking time bomb. *Rated R for language and war violence. Two hours, 1 minute.* — P.C.

**ICE AGE: DAWN OF THE DINOSAURS** ★★☆☆1/2  
(Century 16, Century 20) By bounding happily into outright science fiction, the third film in the "Ice Age" series will work just fine on wide-eyed tots and weary parents glad to take a seat for 94 minutes. Of course, unless you have kids or are a kid, there's really no imperative to see this CGI-animated adventure. It's not bad, but it's also faintly derivative at every turn. This time, Manny the Mammoth and his mate, Ellie (voiced by Ray Romano and Queen Latifah), are expecting a child. Saber-toothed tiger Diego (Denis Leary) is feeling his age when he tries to chase down gazelles. And sloth Sid (John Leguizamo) happens upon three dinosaur eggs to occupy him. When he becomes mama to three baby T. rexes, he buys everyone he knows a lot of trouble. *Rated: PG for some mild rude humor and peril. 1 hour, 34 minutes.* — P.C.

**IN THE LOOP** ★★☆☆1/2  
(Aquarius) Politics, clearly, are comedy gold (just ask Jon Stewart and Stephen Colbert), and yet smart political comedies seem to arrive at theaters only once or twice a decade. Thanks to "In the Loop," it's again time to think and laugh at the same time. One part "Dr. Strangelove" and two parts "The Office," "In the Loop" is a shaky-cam satire that savages government movers and shakers on both sides of the Atlantic. The plot concerns the gung-ho secret committee plotting a war in the Middle East on behalf of the U.S. Presi-

dent and U.K. Prime Minister, and those trying to block the war with strategic leaks and other creative maneuvers. With a bite that's going to leave a mark, "In the Loop" is the year's best comedy to date. *Not MPAA rated. One hour, 49 minutes.* — P.C.

**THE PROPOSAL** ★★☆☆  
(Century 16, Century 20) Sandra Bullock and Ryan Reynolds share a spark and serve up laughs despite a predictable storyline and a few senseless scenarios. Uptight book editor Margaret Tate (Bullock) runs her New York office with all the compassion of a coyote in a chicken coop. Her assistant Andrew (Reynolds) does her bidding, despite urging from his family to quit. When Margaret faces deportation to her native Canada over a neglected visa application, she blackmails Andrew to marry her so she can stay in New York. As Margaret gets to know Andrew's energetic clan — especially his mother (Mary Steenburgen) and grandmother (White) — she begins to shed her icy exterior and look at Andrew as much more than just a latte-fetching flunky. *Rated: PG-13 for sexual content, nudity and language. 1 hour, 47 minutes.* — T.H.

**UP** ★★☆☆  
(Century 16, Century 20) Senior citizen Carl Fredricksen (voice of Edward Asner) wasn't always gruff. He was a boy eager for adventure. He was a loyal husband to his wife, Ellie. He was happy. Following Ellie's death, crews demolished the neighborhood around Carl. Now he sits on his porch, and even young wilderness explorer Russell (voice of Jordan Nagai) can't lift him from his mood. When the threat of being placed in a nursing home confronts Carl, he decides to do something drastic. He attaches balloons to the house's chimney and sets off for Paradise Falls, a mysterious locale in South America that Ellie longed to visit. When Carl realizes he has an accidental stowaway in Russell, his plans for a quiet escape are thrown askew. Hilarious, heartwarming and beautifully animated, "Up" is one of the year's first truly exceptional films. *Rated: PG for some peril and action. 1 hour, 36 minutes.* — T.H.

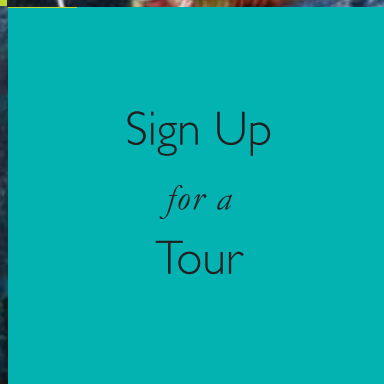
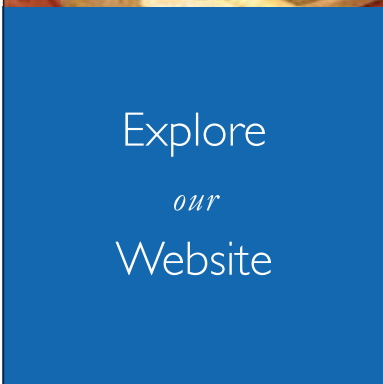
