RANGOON RUBY  
SERVES UP BRIGHT  
FLAVORS AMID  
UPSCALE  
SURROUNDINGS

Just about everyone orders the profoundly beautiful tea leaf salad at Rangoon Ruby, downtown Palo Alto's upscale Burmese hot spot. It tastes as good as it looks.

The only issue is to gauge how much salad you or your party can eat, because you'll want to leave room for other dishes and this one is not good as a leftover. Tea leaf salad quickly degrades into a sad, limp memory.

Rangoon Ruby's gleaming beachhead is fortified by the young and well-heeled. It is nothing like Rangoon, the plain Jane Chinese-Burmese restaurant that used to be on Bryant Street. Rangoon Ruby is pretty much the opposite of the other Burmese restaurant in town, Green Elephant Gourmet, which caters to a neighborhood and family clientele. Located in South Palo Alto, Green Elephant is quieter and cheaper, and features many Chinese dishes.

Under high ceilings and swirling Medusa-like light fixtures, Rangoon Ruby bustles with people enjoying the scene, the bright flavors and the

extensive cocktail menu. It's a good idea to make a reservation.

In addition to whimsical tiki drinks there are microbrews and imports on draft, changing seasonally. Among them recently was Hanger 24 Orange Wheat (\$6), which paired perfectly with the menu's vibrant herbs and spices.

Curiously, the wine list is less fertile. It's overloaded with heavy-duty chardonnays and cabernets.

But back to the signature tea leaf salad (\$14), served in pieces and assembled for you at the table. As with many dishes at Rangoon Ruby, tea leaf salad can be made vegetarian. The standard version involves dried shrimp, Burmese tea leaves, fried garlic, yellow beans, chopped lettuce, jalapeno peppers, sesame seeds and peanuts.

"This special salad will awaken your taste buds," the menu promises. Indeed.

Once awakened, your taste buds may also enjoy fiery pork tofu (\$17). While our neighbors scarfed up their tofu one recent evening, we were having buyers' remorse about our monk hingar (\$13), pureed catfish chowder. It was just dull.

Another Burmese tradition, the noodle dish nan gyi dok (\$14),

is served in components like the salad and then mixed table-side. Rice noodles are slathered in coconut chicken sauce and amplified by yellow bean powder, cilantro and fried onion. Slices of hard-boiled egg add creaminess, the wontons, crispiness.

Burma draws culinary influences from its neighbors. Tastes of Thailand, China and India figure prominently, as do seafood, freshwater fish, rice and noodles.

Dishes arrived at a good pace, not all at once. Rangoon Ruby's servers make a strong effort to please — not a given when dining out.

Our server recommended basil chili beef (\$18), which I liked but

my companion judged not spicy enough.

Rangoon Ruby is loud and sleek. Scenic photo collages climb the walls, white-clothed tables nestle close together, and stylish tableware includes square bowls and food-friendly forks with long tines.

Vegetarian and vegan options abound on the wide-ranging menu.

Rangoon Ruby opened in June 2012, in the former Cafe Baklava. A sister ship opened last May in San Carlos. The chefs are veterans of Burma Superstar, the Bay Area's hot little chain. Owner John Lee, born and raised in Burma, honed his hospitality

MOVIE REVIEWS

THE WIND RISES ★★ ★ 1/2

"All I wanted to do was to make something beautiful." So said aeronautical engineer Jiro Horikoshi, whose Mitsubishi A5M and A6M Zero served the Empire of Japan during WWII. Amid some controversy, living-legendary animator Hayao Miyazaki has written and directed his own latest "something beautiful," this one a hand-drawn fantasia about Horikoshi: "The Wind Rises."

Horikoshi (voiced in the English-language version by Joseph Gordon-Levitt) literally dreams of airplanes. He sets out to study engineering and lands a job at an airplane manufacturer that will build his planes. On this path, he also encounters a young woman named Nahoko (Emily Blunt), who becomes his muse. Nahoko's struggle with tuberculosis informs one of the story's deep-set ironies: In her devotion, Nahoko insists upon Horikoshi achieving his dreams of flight, but in the process, the couple loses valuable time to spend with each other. The film is sentimental and sweet, but as much as it deeply understands the artistic mindset of a driven creator, it also acknowledges the darker implications of a genius' tunnel vision. Despite showcase scenes of Horikoshi's dreams and test flights, "The Wind Rises" in some ways is Miyazaki's most grounded film. Much of the film concerns the plodding work — and gentle, if not delicate, soul — required to achieve beauty, another way in which "The Wind Rises," possibly Miyazaki's swan song, skews to stealth autobiography. *Rated PG-13 for some disturbing images and smoking. Two hours, six minutes.* — P.C.

Gloria ★★ ★

Sebastián Lelio's "Gloria" — Chile's official Oscar submission — insists upon unsettling realities without either stomping on its hero's indomitability or tacking on a deus ex machina. Socially active in Santiago, Gloria (Paulina García) is 58, years divorced and unashamed of enjoying single life to the best of her ability. Gloria refuses to be your stereotype or a writer's stock character. She has dark nights of the soul despite a willful optimism that, this time, she's gonna make it after all. "This time" means Rodolfo (Sergio Hernández), a somewhat older ex-Navy man she picks up on an evening out. The pair embark on a relationship as excitedly sexual as it is romantic. But time doesn't freeze, and relationships get real. Both have adult children and exes that complicate their lives. The film's doggedly realistic subtleties do put a weight of dullness on the scene-to-scene movement of the film. On the other hand, whenever the story reaches for catharsis, it stumbles into cliché, including a love-it-or-hate ending that, for my taste, is a little too on-the-nose. All the same, García rises above any failings to make "Gloria" an anthem for the women Hollywood forgot. *Rated R for sexual content, some graphic nudity, drug use and language. One hour, 50 minutes.* — P.C.

POMPEII ★ 1/2

The new action picture "Pompeii" is a bit like its own villain, Mount Vesuvius: massive, full of hot air and brainless. I won't begrudge it to those who seek nothing

TIM'S VERMEER

★★★

(Guild) Watching paint dry has never been more fascinating than it is in "Tim's Vermeer," a documentary produced by the magicians Penn & Teller.

In his feature debut, Teller directs this account of how inventor Tim Jenison labored to recreate a Vermeer painting using a controversial method. In order to prove that Johannes Vermeer (the 17th Century Dutch Master behind works like "Girl with a Pearl Earring") achieved his near-photo-realistic effects with the aid of technology, Jenison experimented with simple machine designs to find a functional one. The answer, as Jenison sees it, is a type of camera obscura that would have allowed Vermeer to painstakingly paint over a mirrored image of a live tableau.

One might make certain assumptions about the resulting film, but Jenison told Teller, "if I don't succeed there won't be a movie, right?" and the director responded, "Oh, there will be a movie." And indeed the movie has its elements of suspense: will the achingly slow process break Jenison mentally, and can a complete amateur at painting produce a work comparable to that of Vermeer? That latter question explains the great offense taken by many art experts to those who support the theory of Vermeer employing technology: wouldn't such a method turn their old master into something of a fraud?

Others don't see it that way, and Teller and his magician partner Penn Jillette (who serves as narrator and onscreen presence) round up some celebrated folks sympathetic to Jenison's point of view, including English artist David Hockney and comic actor/painter Martin Mull. Such episodes serve to break up potential tedium: Jenison gets out of his studio to Holland and England, where he meets with Hockney and attempts to overcome protocol and examine a Vermeer held in a private area of Buckingham Palace.

The only real knock against "Tim's Vermeer" is that it has the feel of a

television documentary (the style is not unlike a more polite, extended episode of Penn & Teller's own docu-series "Bulls\*\*t!"). But the film earns its keep by being informative and briskly entertaining. It helps that the likeably wry Jenison is such an interesting character in his own right, a true Renaissance man — and self-made millionaire — who has earned the luxury of bettering himself through arts and crafts D.I.Y. hobbyism.

Part of the fun is in the obsessiveness required to even attempt such a stunt, including recruiting and costuming live models (one of whom is Jenison's daughter) and recreating and set-dressing a 17th century room. All types of obsessives (tech-heads, art geeks, and even LARPer) should get a kick out of the lengths to which Jenison goes and the nerdgasm discoveries he makes in the process. The results don't devalue Vermeer, but they do exalt Jenison's spirit of exploration.

300: RISE OF AN EMPIRE

★★ 1/2

"300: Rise of an Empire" is the sort of movie that can short-circuit a film critic's wiring. Both a blood-bath and deliriously entertaining high camp, this prequel-sequel-parallel plotline to Warner Brothers' 2006 hit will appeal mainly to meatheads, but those with a tolerance for over-the-top violence may appreciate it on other levels. One of those levels may be "sexy," given the doubling-down on the fleshiness of "300": in addition to the rock-hard abs and bulging biceps of this ancient battle epic's Greek and Persian forces, "300: Rise of an Empire" features a knockabout sex scene to end all knockabout sex scenes (sorry, Michael Douglas). Another level is classical-epic sweep: this is nothing if not a Homeric blend of legend and myth, with a credible take on glorified Greek attitudes to war

that nods to its horrors while gleefully depicting bone-crushings, stabbings, and amputations of every extremity (see also "The Iliad").

Specifically, "300: Rise of an Empire" concerns Themistokles of Athens (Sullivan Stapleton of TV's "Strike Back"), a politician and general who plies Queen Gorgo of Sparta (Lena Headey) for support in the war against Persian invaders (Gorgo eventually sees off Gerard Butler's Leonidas — glimpsed only in flashback — to the events of "300").

Since Themistokles slew King Darius of Persia at the Battle of Marathon, the Athenian made a formidable enemy of Darius' son Xerxes (Rodrigo Santoro). Xerxes hardly needs the added motivation, but Darius' adoptive daughter Artemisia (full-bore villainess Eva Green) goes all Lady Macbeth on Xerxes, prodding him to restyle himself as a god among men and

whip up the Persian forces to crush Greece. History buffs, take note: this is your chance to see the Battle of Salamis and the Battle of Artemisium misrepresented on screen.

As with "300," the follow-up can be read as a white hat-black hat allegory for domestic democracy versus Middle-Eastern "Others." But one senses that the filmmakers have made a conscious effort to tamp down that nagging, politically incorrect sensibility: for as vampy-bad as Artemisia is, she's given a sympathetic "why I'm bad" backstory, as is Xerxes. By humanizing the Persians a little, this sequel's thankfully not quite as hawkish as its own characters.

Taking the reins from Zack Snyder, Noam Murro could hardly be a more unlikely choice of director. His only other feature directing credit is the entertaining but hardly action-packed 2008 comedy-drama "Smart People," which takes place in Pittsburgh.

And yet Murro both honors the "300" style (after Frank Miller, on whose graphic novels the films are based, with lots of slo-mo and gushing blood) and subtly improves on it with his own touch of tasteful dark lushness (perhaps it's the new color-coding of Athenian cerulean blue replacing Spartan red).

Don't get me wrong: "300: Rise of an Empire" is still pretty garish; it's just sorta garish-pretty. It's also unabashedly hard-"R"-rated, and the fetishization of violence, however Homeric, can be off-putting, especially in deliberately in-your-face 3D. But thanks largely to Green demonstrably having a ball, this strange brew of "Athenian shock combat" and "Abercrombie and Twitch" posing stands little chance of boring audiences.

Rated R for strong sustained sequences of stylized bloody violence throughout, a sex scene, nudity and some language. One hour, twenty minutes.

more than pure sensation from their movies. This latest account of the 79 A.D. volcanic disaster that laid waste to Roman city Pompeii doesn't play games. Rather, it serves up large quantities of gladiatorial clashes, disaster-movie mayhem and fleshy bits (rock-hard abs and juicy thighs, as per the PG-13 rating). But in place of actual drama, the screenplay by Janet Scott Batchler & Lee Batchler ("Batman Forever") and Michael Robert Johnson ("Sherlock Holmes") actively works to make you remember other dramas you've seen, in the hope that narrative shorthand will be enough. Kit Harington and his torso play Milo, who as a wee Celtic boy survived a Roman victory over Celtic rebels only to find himself pressed into slavery and a "career" as a gladiator. Rated PG-13 for intense battle sequences, disaster-related action and brief sexual content. One hour, 45 minutes. —P.C.

WINTER'S TALE ★

"Winter's Tale" seems to have a target audience of those who collect cherub posters, God bless 'em. As adapted by Oscar-winning screenwriter Akiva Goldsman from Mark Helprin's novel, "Winter's Tale" is a spiritual film that runs on Judeo-Christian good-versus-evil mythology and the firm belief that love conquers all, especially if you have a magic flying horse. Colin Farrell plays Peter Lake, an orphan thief who, in 1916 New York, burgles an Upper West Side manse only to find Pre-Raphaelite-esque heiress Beverly Penn (Jessica Brown Findlay) playing Brahms on the piano. The meet-scary gets weirder when Lake asks, "What's wrong with you?" and Penn replies, "Consumption. I'm 21, and I've never been kissed on the mouth." Before you laugh, remember, this is an Oscar-winning screenwriter. Anyway, out of presumable chivalry, Lake doesn't immediately oblige Penn's come-hither-no-seriously-come-hither advances, waiting until he can be sized up skeptically by her dad (William Hurt). Rated PG-13 for violence and some sensuality. One hour, 58 minutes. —P.C.

ROBOCOP ★★★

Wisely, the new "RoboCop" acknowledges how times have changed since Paul Verhoeven's 1987 original. The 2028 setting of director Jose Padilha's film has Americans grappling with the use of advanced "drone" technology: Sure, it's OK as deployed in the streets of Tehran, but Detroit? Not so much. The weapons-technology giant OmniCorp — as per ruthless CEO Raymond Sellars (Michael Keaton) — wants to expand into the domestic market, but they're having trouble bribing the necessary politicians to change the law in their favor. Giving the people what they want, Sellars pursues cyborg technology that will meld ultimate firepower and precision to a consciousness capable of making humane calls about use of force. Intriguingly, much of Joshua Zetumer's screenplay concerns R&D, marketing meetings and product testing of the idea that eventually becomes "RoboCop": a construct built around the remains of wounded-in-action cop Alex Murphy (Joel Kinnaman of "The Killing"). Rated PG-13 for intense sequences of action including fre-

netic gun violence throughout, brief strong language, sensuality and some drug material. One hour, 48 minutes. —P.C.

THE LEGO MOVIE ★★★

It's just another day in Bricksburg for Emmet Brickowski (Chris Pratt, in hilariously bubbly mode), an ordinary, regular, generic construction worker Lego "mini-figure" in a disturbingly conformist world. With his "prodigiously empty mind," Emmet is content to "follow the instructions" by rooting for the local sports team, drinking expensive coffee and singing insidiously infectious pop song "Everything is Awesome!!!" while he works. But a freedom fighter named Wyldstyle (Elizabeth Banks) informs Emmet he might be "the Special" prophesied by a wizard named Vitruvius (Morgan Freeman). The surreal narrative that follows riffs on "The Matrix," with its hero getting his mind blown by alternate realities as he comes to terms with being, just maybe, the only one who can save Legokind. Dastardly President Business (Will Ferrell) wields corporate control over everything (including voting machines) and plans to freeze society into the polar opposite of freedom. Armed with "the piece of resistance" and aided by a team of "Master Builders" who "change everything," Emmet sets off on his Hero's Journey. Rated PG for mild action and rude humor. One hour, 40 minutes. —P.C.

THE MONUMENTS MEN

Adapted by George Clooney and Grant Heslov from the book by Robert M. Edsel (with Bret Witter), "The Monuments Men" merrily fictionalizes the true story of the Allied armies' Monuments, Fine Arts, and Archives program, tasked with recovering, restoring and returning to rightful owners buildings, monuments and artwork — while the Nazis continue to steal paintings and sculptures for a planned Fuhrer Museum. Clooney plays art historian Frank Stokes (patterned on conservationist George L. Stout), who presses for the importance of saving monuments from bombs, and art from Hitler's grubby little hands. Stokes recruits art restorer James Granger (Matt Damon), architect Richard Campbell (Bill Murray), sculptor Walter Garfield (John Goodman), French art dealer Jean Claude Clermont (Jean Dujardin), theater director Preston Savitz (Bob Balaban) and British art consultant Donald Jeffries (Hugh Bonneville) to shadow troops and gain access to lost or endangered art. The aging monuments men's mission requires them to submit to basic training and face life-threatening dangers in the field, but as we're told again and again, the risk is worth the reward. Rated PG-13 for some images of war violence and historical smoking. One hour, 58 minutes. —P.C.


